BIOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION

Tom Payton

Director Power Purchasing Occidental Energy Ventures Corporation

In his position as Director Power Purchasing, Tom Payton is responsible for electric supply for Occidental's Oil and Gas and Chemical operations in Texas and other eastern U.S. locations. Tom is also responsible for marketing wholesale power for Occidental's cogeneration facilities along the Gulf Coast and for operation of Occidental's self-serve Retail Electric Provider in ERCOT.
