



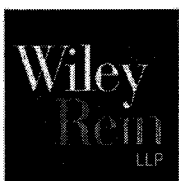

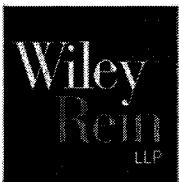
Dear Ms. Dortch:

Telecom Argentina USA, Inc. ("Telecom Argentina USA"), by counsel, supplements the above-referenced application to discontinue the provision of retail telecommunications services. As described below, Telecom Argentina USA has provided copies of its discontinuance application to commissions and governors in several additional states.

As described in the pending application, Telecom Argentina USA's pre-paid calling cards are distributed by one distributor via point-of-sale kiosks in Florida and New Jersey and online. Telecom Argentina USA previously provided copies of the application to state commissions and governors in Florida and New Jersey. Due to sale of the cards online, it is possible there are customers located in other U.S. states and territories. Telecom Argentina USA does not have access to or contact information regarding individual customers, but is able to confirm that calls made using pre-paid calling cards had originating numbers that correspond to the following additional states: Alaska, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Georgia, Illinois, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New York, North Carolina, Oregon, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Texas, Virginia, Wisconsin, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands. Because there is a possibility customers are located in these states, Telecom Argentina has provided copies of the application to discontinue service to commissions and governors in these states.¹ A copy of the supplemental certificate of service is attached.

**SECTION 63.71 AND SECTION 63.19 APPLICATION OF
TELECOM ARGENTINA USA, INC.**

Telecom Argentina USA, Inc. ("Telecom Argentina USA") hereby submits this application for authority under Section 214 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. § 214, and Sections 63.71 and 63.19 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 63.71 and 63.19, to discontinue the provision of retail telecommunications services. In support of this application, Telecom Argentina USA submits the following:

1. Name and Address of Carrier (47 C.F.R. §§ 63.71(a)(1) and (b)(2))

2. Date of Planned Discontinuance (47 C.F.R. §§ 63.71(a)(2) and (b)(2))

Telecom Argentina USA plans to discontinue its retail telecommunications services as of March 28, 2014, or as soon as possible once the necessary regulatory approvals have been obtained.

3. Points of Geographic Areas of Service Affected (47 C.F.R. §§ 63.71(a)(3) and (b)(2))

Telecom Argentina USA provides a call forwarding service to approximately 600

customers located throughout the United States.

Telecom Argentina USA also provides a pre-paid calling card service. Cards are only distributed by one distributor via point-of-sale kiosks in Florida and New Jersey and online, but can be used to place domestic and international calls throughout the United States.

4. Brief Description of Type of Service Affected (47 C.F.R. §§ 63.71(a)(4) and (b)(2))

Telecom Argentina USA provides two types of telecommunications services: a call forwarding service and a pre-paid calling card service.

Telecom Argentina USA's call forwarding service is an international call forwarding service. Telecom Argentina USA assigns a local number from Argentina, which is automatically forwarded to the number of choice of the customer in the United States. This service allows a customer's relatives from Argentina to reach the customer abroad dialing only a local phone number.

Telecom Argentina USA currently distributes calling cards only in the state of Florida and New Jersey via point-of sale kiosks and online, with one active distributor. These cards can be used anywhere within the United States to place domestic and international calls.

Although at one time Telecom Argentina USA had many customers and higher revenues from its call forwarding and pre-paid calling card services, these businesses have decreased in recent years. Telecom Argentina USA no longer actively markets these services and is not currently investing resources in them. Currently, Telecom Argentina USA provides a call forwarding service to approximately 600 customers. Less than 1,000 pre-paid calling cards are distributed per month.

5. Brief Description of the Dates and Methods of Notice to All Affected Customers (47 C.F.R. § 63.71(b)(3))

Telecom Argentina USA has written contracts with each of its call forwarding customers.

The company has provided customers written notification of this discontinuance through correspondence sent February 10, 2014. A copy of this customer notification is included as Exhibit A.

Telecom Argentina USA does not sell its calling cards directly to end users. Rather, it sells the cards through a distributor. Each calling card has a user identification number associated with it. The holder of a calling card accesses Telecom Argentina USA's system by calling an 800 number or a local access number and entering his or her identification number, followed by the number to be called. The cost of the call is deducted from the amount that the holder of the calling card has prepaid. The calling cards are sold in denominations of \$2 and \$5. These cards are all sold by one distributor on the Internet or via point-of-sales kiosks.

Section 63.71(a) of the rules requires that domestic carriers either: (1) notify each affected customer of a proposed discontinuance; or (2) show good cause for providing a different form of notice.¹ The Commission previously has recognized that, in the case of prepaid calling card services, there is good cause for using an alternate method to notify customers.² In such cases, the Commission granted has granted applications to discontinue service without requiring prepaid calling card companies to provide written notice to individual customers.³

Telecom Argentina USA has no direct relationship with the end users of its calling cards, and therefore has no means for providing written notice of a discontinuance of service to each end user. As described above, Telecom Argentina USA distributes its calling cards through only one distributor. The company has requested that the distributor cease its sale of any unsold

cards.

Telecom Argentina USA has established a computer generated message that customers will hear when they call the customer service number available on the cards, alerting them as to the last date that the cards may be used. Customers who have unused funds on their cards after the March 28, 2014 discontinuance date may contact customer service, where they will receive directions on how to return unused cards to receive a full refund. The refund will be either provided as a credit on the customer's credit card or by check sent by mail, based on the customer's preference. Moreover, the prepaid calling card business is extremely competitive and customers will continue to have numerous alternative carriers to provide prepaid calling card services.

Copies of this Application are being sent via first class U.S. Mail to the governors and public service commissions of Florida and New Jersey and the Special Assistant for Telecommunications to the Secretary of Defense. Because Telecom Argentina USA also seeks to discontinue the provision of international services through its international Section 214 authorization, IBFS File No. ITC-214-20010129-00034, copies of this Application are also being sent to the Chief of the International Bureau.

6. Regulatory Classification of Carrier (47 C.F.R. § 63.71(b)(4)):

Telecom Argentina USA is non-dominant with respect to the services that it proposes to discontinue.

Conclusion

For the foregoing reasons, Telecom Argentina USA requests that the Commission, as expeditiously as possible, issue a public notice announcing the filing of Telecom Argentina USA's application to discontinue service, and that, in accordance with its discontinuance procedures, the Commission provide for the application to be granted automatically on the thirty-

first day after the public notice has been released.
