COMES NOW, the Office of Public Utility Counsel ("OPC"), Intervenor, and files this, its Motion To Intervene in the above-captioned proceeding, pursuant to P.U.C. PROC. R. § 22.103(b), and in support thereof would show:

I.

Intervenor is an independent agency of the State of Texas expressly authorized by law to represent the interests of residential and small commercial consumer classes in proceedings before the Public Utility Commission of Texas ("Commission").
