(1) Describe the specific initiatives, programs, and activities undertaken under the plan during the preceding year:

Unite Private Networks, LLC ("UPN") understands the importance of Historically Under Utilized Business, Small Business, Minority-owned Business Enterprises, and Women-owned Business Enterprises and makes every effort to utilize these entities in the state of Texas. It is UPN's policy to employ contractors who share our same dedication to the promotion of workforce diversity and utilization of HUB's and similarly categorized businesses ("HUB's").

In the 2015 reporting period, UPN's presence in Texas grew from thirteen employee to fourteen employees and from five customers to twenty-four customers. We were able to partner with three HUB companies during the 2015 year. We are proud that we can help advance these businesses and will continue to do so.

We consider the outcome of our HUB and diversity policies to be very successful. As noted in the response to question one above, we have twenty-four customers in Texas and employed three HUB companies during 2015. Considering UPN's contractors' utilization of HUB's, UPN has a significant utilization rate of HUB's in Texas.

(3) Describe the initiatives, programs, and activities the utility will pursue during the next year to increase the diversity of its workforce and contracting opportunities for small and historically underutilized businesses:

UPN will continue its current success and will strive toward increasing the amount of HUB utilization relating to Texas contracts. It will do this by continuing to draft provisions in contracts and by employing contractors who utilize HUB's, when possible. As UPN grows and contracts with more customers, we project to use even more HUB's.
