



You are receiving this letter because Anahua National Wildlife Refuge is within 1,000 feet of the centerline of the relocation transmission line. ETT will not need to seek right-of-way from Anahua National Wildlife Refuge in order to construct and operate this transmission line as it will be located in TXDOT right-of-way and other government-owned right-of-way.

Electric capacity needed for the rebuilding of communities in High Island and the Bolivar Peninsula, within TXDOT right-of-way and other government-owned right-of-way. This transmission line will provide the Substation on Fifth Street. The transmission line will be a single circuit, single pole, 69kV line located entirely government-owned right-of-way, through town starting just north of Bayou Landings Road to ETT's Himer located in High Island, where the line will be relocated along Hwy 124, in TXDOT right-of-way and other environmental concerns. One area is just north of the Intracoastal Waterway along Hwy 124 and the other area is other government-owned right-of-way in order to facilitate restoration in future events and to eliminate marshy areas, which are difficult to access, to the Texas Department of Transportation ("TDOT") right-of-way and however, there are two areas in which ETT will take advantage of this reconstruction by moving the line from 69kV transmission line from Stowell to High Island. The line will primarily be reconstructed in its present location; serving High Island and the Bolivar Peninsula. As part of its ongoing restoration efforts, ETT will be rebuilding the service facility in High Island to Energy Texas Inc. ("ETT") electrical facilities

In this effort we request that certain precautions be taken to minimize impacts to fragile coastal marsh habitats. Light-weight tracked vehicles should be used where ever possible to reduce habitat damage. Airboats should be considered if available. Every effort should be made to reduce the amount of travel needed in the marsh. Additionally, tracked equipment should move over slightly on each pass to avoid running over the same patch of marsh twice. Marsh plants are under a lot of physical stress following Hurricane Ike and normally acceptable practices may now cause plant mortality. These precautions will help reduce long-term damage to the marsh.

Each year we relocate the transmission line off of the refuge due to the ingress and egress of equipment used to repair the line caused to the marsh grass in the refuge due to the ingress and egress of equipment used to repair the line. 
