# DEFINITIONS

## Access Lines UNE-Loop Access Line Platform Provisioning by carriers through the purchase of a service that is under a commercial agreement that takes the place of an unbundled network element platform (UNE-P), without use of the carrier's own facilities. An example is and the carrier's own switching facilities. Provisioning by carriers through a combination of loop unbundled network elements (UNEs) leased from the ILEC service. Include revenue producing lines only. telephone calls on the PTSN. VGE lines include high capacity lines that are channelized to provide voice grade channels that directly connect an end user to a carrier and allow the end user to originate and terminate local circuits. Counts should include voice-grade equivalent (VGE) lines (or wireless channels), which are lines or payphone lines; POTS lines provided over Centrex extensions or trunks; and POTS provisioned over high-capacity services provided using fixed wireless, cable-coaxial, or other technologies; traditional analog POTS lines; or Plexar) per end user line, BETRS).
