David W Jefferies, Individually
and as Trustee of the David
W. Jefferies Trust and as Trustee
of the Peggy S. Jackson Trust.

Myself and the (2) two above listed trusts
own property in South Central Jones County,
Texas along Bitter Creek, a tributary of
the Clear Fork of the Brazos. Lone Star
Transmission has plans to construct a 345KV
transmission line along preferred route Link I,
Link J and possible alternate route Link K.
Individually and as trustee, I am opposed
to the 345KV line being constructed
on and through our place. The preferred
route would go west to east through 1120

the entire place. (1 1/4 mi²). The construction²
and maintenance of a 345KV electric line through
our place would greatly reduce the value of
the land. Another damaging consideration
to our lands would be the interference
and agitation of our wildlife habitat
areas. Dove & Quail are present on our
place as well as a few Turkey and
Beaver. A few deer have established a
home on our place during the last
2 to 3 years. Construction and maintenance
of a 345KV electric line through our
place would surely run the deer off and
back up to the Clear Fork area. Of major
importance to me and my family is
the damage and destruction to
Indian artifacts associated with the
disturbance by men & machinery of the
lands around Link Endpoint - East of I,
West of J and North of K. See map-Exhibit A.

In September 1993, the "corner tang" knife shown in photocopy - exhibit B-1, was found by myself just south-southwest of Link Endpoint for I, J, K. Wow, what a archaeological discovery! Sent off in 1997 for authentication by Tim Alexander to Gregory Perino.

The knife is authentic, 2,500 to 3,000 years old. Exhibit B-2 and B-3 are photo-copies of "scrapers" found individually during the past 15 years in the areas north/northwest and west/southwest of Link Endpoint for I, J, K. We do not want any of the areas that could contain Indian artifacts worked over, looked over, picked over, driven over, etc.

At the settlement conference July 19, 2010 in Abilene, TX we talked about the Central Route (preferred) and the Northern Route (alternate). The general consensus was quite negative toward the central route (C, D, E, I, J, K) and quite positive/favorable

toward the Northern Route. This is in the relationship of getting from Central A (Scurry County) to Central C (Shackelford County)

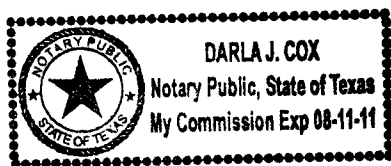
I would recommend using link A then Link G for getting from Central A to Central C.

One of the links that I would definitely not use is Link H in far western Jones County. The soil type is extremely fragile; a type of "blow sand" with not much stability.

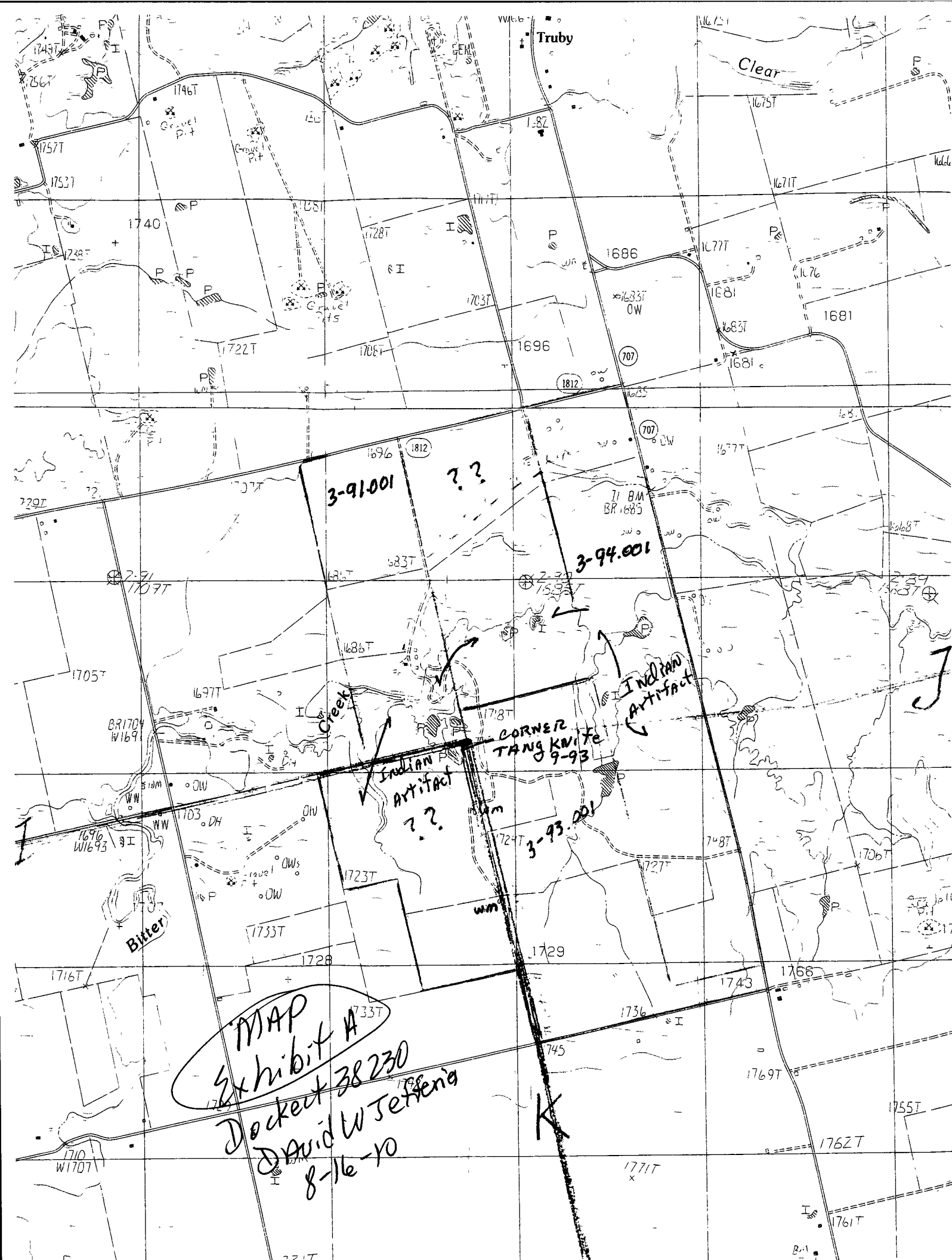
