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IONI CREEK CONSERVATION GROUP'S RESPONSE TO LONE STAR TRANSMISSION, LLC'S FIRST REQUEST FOR INFORMATION

IONI Creek Conservation Group ("ICCG") hereby files their responses to Lone Star Transmission, LLC's ("Lone Star") First Request for Information ("RFIs") to ICCG. These responses are timely filed.

I. Written Responses.

ICCG's written responses to Lone Star's First RFIs are attached and incorporated by reference. Each response is stated on or attached to a separate page on which the request has been restated. ICCG's responses are made in the spirit of cooperation without waiving ICCG's right to contest the admissibility of any of these matters at hearing. Each response lists the person who provided information responsive to the question. When ICCG provides certain information sought by the request while objecting to the provision of information, they do so without prejudice to their objection in the interests of narrowing discovery disputes pursuant to P.U.C. PROC. R 22.144(c)(2)(F), ICCG stipulates that their responses may be treated by all parties as if they were made under oath by the respective respondent.

- 1. If you contend that Lone Star Transmission Project will affect seeps being used for domestic water supply, please answer the following questions:
 - a. Provide your definition of "seeps" as used in this context.
 - b. Provide a map that depicts the exact location of all "seeps" on all properties of all members of your group.
 - c. Identify the domestic water supply source that the aforementioned seeps flow into or contribute too [sic].
 - d. Produce a map depicting the location of the domestic water supply serving each of your members.
 - e. Please describe fully all impacts you contend that the Lone Star Transmission Project will have on contamination of a domestic water supply, whether on your property or otherwise. Please produce all authorities, documents, analyses or studies relied upon in reaching such conclusions.

Response:

The ICCG members are not contending that the proposed transmission line will definitely have a direct impact on their water supply. However, the Link Ranch's only domestic water is supplied by the Mountain Springs, and the Stuart Ranch's livestock water is supplied by seeps. The owners of these ranches have concerns over the possible impacts of the line on the seeps and springs, including but not limited to the water supply, aesthetics, and values and characteristics of the ranches.

a. The ICCG members, as non-experts, have at times used the terms seeps and springs interchangeably and consider each to be water that travels under ground to either trickle out of the ground into a pool (seep) or collect underground and eventually emerge from below the surface at particular point (spring). Regarding the definition of springs, see also ICCG's response to Lone Star RFI 1-1(c) in which the Mountain Springs on the Link Ranch are described.

b. Please see the attached map that marks with a red dot on the Link Ranch ("L") the general location of the Mountain Springs.

The seeps and springs on thee Stuart Ranch are in the general area where the link HH of the proposed line crosses a steep limestone cliff that is about 80 feet above the surface of Ioni Creek. [There are about 30 seeps and springs on the Stuart Ranch of varying sizes.] An "X" on the attached map marks the general location of these seeps and springs.

c. Mountain Springs is the name of the spring that provides the only domestic water supply source for the Link Ranch. Mountain Springs is located on the side of a hill at a mapped estimated elevation of 1470 feet above sea level. It is the collection point of a broad subsurface area flowing fresh water through subsurface formations or channels from an even or slightly higher elevation from the upper caprock area, being generally the areas north and west of the spring. The collection point itself is a hand dug, rock lined well that was built around the 1940's. It is only a few feet deep, and from this collection point, water is piped to the ranch housing and improvements for drinking and other domestic use. The Link Ranch has studied and geologically mapped this spring and watershed or source area since 1960, specifically for protection purposes. The proposed transmission line crosses this watershed or source area.

On the Stuart Ranch, the seeps and springs are a collection point in themselves for the livestock on the ranch.

- d. Please see the attached map for the location of the well on the Link Ranch. The red dot on the Link Ranch ("L") marks the location of the well and the general location of the Mountain Springs.
- e. Again, the ICCG members are not contending that the proposed transmission line will definitely impact their water supplies but have concerns over possible impacts of the line on the seeps and springs, including but not limited to the water supply, aesthetics, and values and characteristics of the ranches.
