Now, Lone Star Transmission and the Texas Public Utilty Commission wants to build a high voltage unsightly power line across one end of my property.

I know we need energy sources, but the transmission line could and should be built on the alternate route to the south

If you take the northern route through Erath County, you will destroy beautiful landscape which can not be replaced.

If you take the alternate southern route, there is less scenic landscape, cost can be reduced by the lower land cost on the southern route; and constrution cost can be reduced due to the more even terrain.
