I am writing to you as a concerned resident of the TLR Subdivision of Gillespie County, TX. regarding the (bad) idea of placing an enormous electrical transmission line through the middle of the subdivision. Please consider the following:

- (1) TLR Subdivision is an old and established residential subdivision consisting of over 200 homes. There is open land just East of our subdivision which I understand is available and already has one transmission line in place. I also understand that LCRA has proposed this as a possible route. Why would anyone want to place such a transmission through the middle of a longstanding neighborhood when a simple, non-controversial alternative exists?
- (2) I understand that the proposed transmission line will be placed in close proximity to an existing natural gas pipeline and our small airport. These are unnecessary risks and should any property or casualty losses result from this, I believe that any commercial interests involved will be aggressively held responsible.
- (3) We have been advised by professionals that placement of a transmission line through the middle of our subdivision will lower property values. The residents in our neighborhood pay substantial taxes to Gillespie County and to the Harper ISD. Should this transmission line be placed through our neighborhood, I will expect a substantial (up to 40%) reduction in my property and school taxes. Additionally, I would expect to receive a reimbursement from the commercial interests developing this transmission line for any loss of equity resulting from their placement of the line.
- (4) My neighborhood and indeed a good part of the local Hill Country economy is based on people living and visiting the area to enjoy the beauty, solitude, and wild qualities of the land. This has been a theme here at Tierra Linda Subdivision since its inception. Our HOA has worked diligently for many years to preserve these qualities. We are to receive no benefit from the proposed transmission lines, only the detrimental effects and I do not understand why anyone would arbitrarily visit this nuisance upon our neighborhood.

Lastly, I am looking to our State and County political representatives for some assistance in finding a reasonable solution to the placement of these transmission lines. I

am in the energy business myself and understand the need to bring power generated by the West Texas wind farms to market, but the interests of those who are already here must be taken seriously. I will be taking note of who steps up for our subdivision in the ongoing PUC deliberations and I feel sure my neighbors will be too.
