JOINT STIPULATION AND AGREEMENT REGARDING ORDER NO. 6

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I. AGREEMENT NOT TO APPEAL AND RESERVATION OF CERTAIN RIGHTS

Electric Transmission Texas, LLC (ETT), Sharyland Utilities, L.P. (Sharyland), Joint Landowners,¹ City of McAllen, and EIA/Dougherty² (collectively, the Signatories) agree that Order No. 6 reasonably resolves the issues relating to route adequacy in this docket, specifically that routes formed with noticed links, including Link 169, that do not progress through the Joint Applicants' identified "routing circle" are viable routes that can be considered for approval, and therefore agree not to appeal the order to the Commission. However, the Signatories may have reservations regarding some statements contained within Order No. 6. Therefore the Signatories have reached an agreement that their decision not to appeal Order No. 6 to the Commission does not constitute a waiver of any argument (other than those concerning the adequacy of the routes presented in the application when routes consisting of noticed links that do not pass through the routing circle are also included for consideration as viable routes) with respect to statements, findings, conclusions, and recommendations contained therein, that Order No. 6 is limited to

issues concerning route adequacy, and that the Signatories are free to litigate issues discussed in Order No. 6 as they relate to issues in dispute in the final hearing on the merits. Additionally, Commission Staff and the other parties who participated in the route adequacy hearing³ have authorized Signatories to state that they are not opposed to this stipulation.

II. CLERICAL CORRECTIONS TO ORDER NO. 6

Additionally, the Signatories have identified the following clerical errors in Order No. 6 that should be corrected to preserve the record and prevent confusion:

- Routes orienting from the North Edinburg substation towards the <u>east west</u> must pass through Link 84b, which is <u>0.74</u> miles long. All routes orienting <u>west east</u> from the North Edinburg substation must pass through Link<u>s 134 and</u> 137b, which <u>is are 1.56</u> miles and 2.09 miles long, respectively.

- Staff further indicates that the ALJ and Commission should be able to consider routes that use already-proposed links that exit the North Edinburg substation to the east, run in a southern/southeastern direction along the eastern side of the city of McAllen, and then turn to the east towards Loma Alta. This suggestion contemplates eliminating all routes exiting to the west of the City of McAllen. Page 11
- Rather, it is the north-south <u>east-west</u> flow from the North Edinburg to the Loma Alta substation that is critical to address short-term power requirements in the Valley. Page 16
- Even the route affecting the lowest number of habitable structures, Route <u>26-32</u>, affects 465 structures and, of course, the people within them. The proposed route affecting the highest number of affected habitable structures, Route <u>32 26</u>, affects 1,818 structures and the people within them. Pages 17–18
- Mr. Dauphinais identified three routes <u>one route</u> (BAI-1, BAI-2, and BAI-3) from noticed links that travels east from the North Edinburg substation but do<u>es</u> not backtrack to the proximity circle with lower costs and affecting less habitable structures. Page <u>19-</u>20
- Similarly for the lines exiting to the west, there is a <u>0.</u>74-mile-long chokepoint on Link 84b

III. CONCLUSION

Additionally, the Parties request that the ALJ make the above-listed clarifications to Order No. 6.
