I'm writing to comment on the proposed high capacity transmission electricity line that will cross my property here in Edinburg, TX. Such proposed route will go about one mile north from its source and then cuts across west towards its destination.


I believe going north one mile is not enough because the transmission line will intrude in a heavily populated area now and more so in the future.

A more reasonable and responsible planning would be for the proposed route to be placed further north about two to three miles from its source and then west to its destination. The population is less dense in that area, and therefore, its impact less severe.

I know utility companies are business and will try to optimize profits, but like all business they must show responsible planning in their projects.
