Dear Chairman Nelson:

I am writing you on behalf of my family, friends and neighbors who live in Frisco, Texas.

We are writing to ask you to oppose and take action to stop Brazos Electric's proposed power line project for Main Street or Stonebrook Parkway in Frisco, TX. We strongly encourage you to ask the company to seek alternative routes that do not impact our city and residents so horrifically. The proposed routes are in densely populated areas and will impact over 30,000 residents. There are four schools that currently exist or are planned along the proposed Stonebrook Parkway route. Just think, our children's entire education will take place in an electromagnetic field. Can you just imagine all the unknown and potentially dangerous health consequences?

I am sure Brazos' proposal is a "low cost," quick, and easy alternative to go straight through the middle of our growing, family-oriented community. Their proposal will negatively impact real estate and business development. They also say that the board speaks for its' shareholders and therefore we have a voice in how "our" electric company is ran. I will be quite honest with you.... I have looked high and low and have been unable to find a phone number or email address for Jerry Cobb, our District 4 representative. I guess that explains how interested CoServ is with what its' owners have to say.

I encourage you as the Chairman as well as your Commissioners to oppose this and make Brazos and CoServ do the right thing for Frisco. I also request that any public hearings be held here in Frisco to accommodate the many residents who will want to speak and be heard on this important issue.
