This letter is to let it be known that I am **opposed** to having 12 story tall utility towers cutting through the middle of Frisco, Texas. Our city is the fastest growing city in the United States. Not only are the proposed lines aesthetically unappealing but they are not immediately necessary since according to current projections for the area through 2018 these lines are at only 73% of capacity

If the lines are deemed necessary now by the PUC, the best option of all is **BURYING THE LINES**. City ordinances in place already call for the lines to be buried.

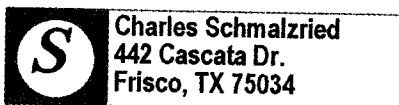
