Mr. Anderson:

Please let it be known to you and recorded that my family and I **STRONGLY** oppose the proposals being submitted by the Brazos Electric Power Cooperative Inc. relating to the Stonebrook Transmission Line and Substation Project, and we encourage you, as an official appointed by the Governor of Texas to serve our community, to voice such concerns to all appropriate parties and to join with us to aggressively pursue other more viable and less invasive options.

Specifically, these proposals shall clear the way for Brazos Electric Power Cooperative to install and operate above-ground high voltage power lines directly through densely populated neighborhoods in Frisco, Texas with a huge population of young children and families, including schools, parks, churches, homes and local businesses. The proposals being sought for approval are absolutely unacceptable, as there is substantial health-related concerns over the impact of electromagnetic fields generated from high voltage power lines. Further, such an action by Brazos Electric Power Company invades our property rights and rights to property value preservation, and any such move will, most certainly, create financial losses to many, many people living along or around the proposed route(s).

We understand that there is an alternative route for such transmission lines and substation that would have such a route go through lands controlled by the Army Corps of Engineers, however, bureaucratic "red tape" and an apparent unwillingness or inability of the Army Corps of Engineers to review and/or consider such an alternative is preventing the Brazos Electric Power Cooperative Inc. from pursuing this more viable and less invasive option.

We are hopeful that you will vehemently oppose the current proposals outlined for the Stonebrook Transmission Line and Substation Project - to protect the health interests of children and young families in Frisco, Texas and to prevent financial loss of property values in the affected areas. In addition, we implore you to support legislation requiring power companies to protect the health interests of communities by burying power lines below ground, understanding that such a requirement could be more costly and that our electrical rates could be increased as a result.
