Pages 1625-1626 represent two invoices that total the fixed price. Because the Dismantling Cost Study was used for both the Texas proceeding and a rate proceeding SPS filed at the New Mexico Public Regulation Commission, the cost for the study was allocated between the Texas and New Mexico retail jurisdictions based on the Texas and New Mexico retail jurisdictions' relative proportions of plant. (73% to Texas and 27% to New Mexico.) Therefore, of the \$75,200 fee for the study, Texas was allocated \$54,896.

The fees reflected on the invoice on pages 1627 and 1628 are for services TLG Services personnel performed, including drafting and revising the Direct Testimony of Francis W. Seymore, and attending teleconferences to discuss testimony. These services are billed based on time and materials pricing. Because similar testimony was used in both the Texas and New Mexico proceedings, 73% of the fees in this invoice were allocated to Texas (\$3,286.46).

("GDHM") in Docket No. 40824. August 2012 was the first month of the Direct Testimony Phase of Docket No. 40824. GDHM agreed to perform its work in the Direct Testimony Phase for a professional fee of \$280,000, to be paid in four installments of \$70,000 each in September, October, November and December 2012. GDHM's invoice for August work, which was submitted in September, would have reflected a professional fee of \$33,615 based upon hourly billing rates and hours worked. Per its agreement with SPS, however, GDHM billed a professional fee of \$70,000 rather than \$33,615. The adjustments in question were entered into the accounting system used by Xcel Energy to process legal bills (IQNavigator) and collectively account for the difference (\$36,385) between the \$70,000 fee being billed and the \$33,615 value of hours worked in August. In the absence of such adjustments, the IQNavigator system would have rejected the invoice in question because the \$70,000 fee would appear to the computer to be over-billing based on the time worked and hourly billing rates.

The \$36,385 adjustment was divided pro-rata among time keepers reporting time on the original bill. For example, Tom Hudson's total billings, based on hours worked and his billing rate, would have been \$10,202.50, which is 30.3510337% of the \$33,615 fee. Thus, his share of the adjustment was \$11,043.22 (.303510337 x \$36,385), which is found on line 94 of page 1673 of Exhibit SPS-Staff 2-16(V).

Over the course of the direct testimony phase of Docket No. 40824, the flat fee billed by GDHM was approximately the same dollar amount as it would have been if GDHM had been billing on an hourly basis.

In Kansas, SPS is asked to provide an appraisal if it chooses to do so along with the annual rendition of property. For 2013, Kansas accepted the appraisal of SPS assets that was submitted by SPS.

In New Mexico, SPS has been able to achieve a ten percent reduction from net book value of the personal property and as economic obsolescence. The real property is appraised locally, and the real estate appraisal incorporates all obsolescence in the market value conclusion. CWIP is considered to have a market value of 50% of what SPS has on its books. Therefore no obsolescence is warranted.

Please refer to Exhibit SPS-Staff 11-62(CONF) for the calculation of property tax savings arising from SPS's protests of Texas appraisals in 2013.

The Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts ("TCPA") conducts a study of school district assessed values in odd-numbered years. The study is used for state funding to school districts. The study includes an independent appraisal of SPS property by the TCPA and allocations to the various school districts in Texas. Then the TCPA allocated value is compared to the assessed value the school district will use for property tax purposes. The ratio of actual property tax values to the TCPA's estimate of value in the school districts was 93 percent in 2013. The suggestion was that the SPS efforts in minimizing property tax expense resulted in taxes that are 7 percent less than what the TCPA considers reasonable. In its study, the TCPA has a tolerance level of +/- 10 percent.
