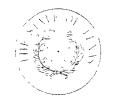

On September 18, 2013, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) received your application for a Water Rate Rate/tariff change for the above referenced utility. Your application has been assigned Docket No. 2014-0631-UCR. Any further communication should refer to this docket number.

The TCEQ has received 27 protests from a total of 92 customers, which is more than ten percent (10%) of your affected customers. This matter has been referred to the State Office of Administrative Hearings for scheduling. Once the hearing is scheduled, you will receive a notice of hearing explaining when and where the hearing will be held.

In order to review this rate change request, the staff of the TCEQ may need additional information regarding your utility's cost of providing service. Thank you for your response received on 11/1/2013, regarding the above referenced application. Your application has been accepted for filing and assigned Application No. 37728-R. Please refer to this number in future correspondence.

Your new rates may go into effect on January 1, 2014. Your new effective date must be at least 60 days following the date your completed applications were mailed to us and correct notice is mailed or delivered to the customers. The effective date of the new rates must be the first day of the billing period, and the new rates may not apply to service provided before the effective date of the new rates.

The application will be scheduled for a hearing if:

- the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) receives complaints from at least 10% of the ratepayers within 90 days of the effective date of the rate increase, or
- TCEQ staff protests the application on its own motion.

You will be notified if a hearing is scheduled. If, during the course of a hearing, rates are set which are different from the rates charged by the Utility, you may be required to refund or credit future bills. The refund or credit will include all sums collected during the pendency of the rate proceeding in excess of the rate finally ordered, plus interest, as determined by the TCEQ.

TCEQ Rate Review

Re: Rate Change App. Explanation of included engineering documentation.

Dear Ms. Benter:

The recently declined South Port Alto Mud engineers of record were G&W Engineers, Inc. I have included the engineered stamped "Itemized Summary of Costs for Proposed South Port A lot M.U.D. which contains their bid or the Water System Upgrades. This document was submitted on February 2011 and was still in effect the date the MUD was refused in Austin a few months back on March 2013. I took their numbers and changed a few bids that I had gotten and managed to reduce the engineers projected cost by \$126,000. The largest cost savings came in the form of Item 21 on my list "Labor to install 4" taps". G&W had a bid of \$1200 each and I calculate that I can get this done for \$500. This is a savings of \$700 for each of the 96 connections or \$67,000. I chose not to include the entire lengthy set of engineered paperwork but only the page that referenced the Itemized Summary of Cost and the official seal of the engineer.

In most cases my spreadsheet clearly states the name of the bidding company (i.e. INFINITY meters), the retailer (i.e. USA Bluebook), the engineer (i.e. G&W), or simply the words BID for the work I will do myself with or without the help of local plumbers, electricians, etc.

I have a file with copies of all the actual bids from these various companies that I plan on bringing to the expected protest hearing for public viewing. Our plans are to bring multiple copies of all this documentation to the hearing to be distributed to all the interested parties in hopes of providing full transparency.

district water connections in addition to the existing 96. The calculation of these existing and future service connections are detailed in the Land Use Table (Exhibit 14). Without the formation of the Municipal Utility District and the construction of public sewer collection services, any tracts less than 0.5 acres will not be permitted to be developed using on-site sewer systems.

7. Provide an itemized summary of costs which includes (but not limited to): utilities, clearing and erasion control, water and wastewater plant, lift station and/or force main(s), off-site water lines and connections, construction contingencies, legal, financial agent and engineering fees, interest costs, operating expenses, creation costs, OSSF decommissioning costs and land costs.

The MUD will not be assuming the responsibilities for storm drainage within the district. Calhoun County Precinct No. 4 currently maintains the storm drainage system within the area of the proposed district and will continue to do so after the formation of the district.

Provide a detailed land use table which describes the development type (single fumily residence, commercial, multifamily); the assessed value for each type, the equivalent single family connections for each type; the acreage for each type. As stated above, there are approximately 20 potential future single family residences that may be developed within the district boundaries. If we assume an average value of \$150,000 for these improvements, this would equate to an additional \$3,000,000 valuation, for a lotal of \$17.9 million dollars assessed valuation for the potential build-out in today's dollars.

Based on an administrative review of your application, it appears the notice to customers contains deficiencies. To continue processing the application, you must complete and revise the following portions of the notice:

The effective date of your rate change is hereby suspended until the deficiencies are corrected and your customers are re-noticed. Your new effective date must be at least 60 days following the date the completed application is mailed to us, and correct notice is mailed or delivered to the customers. It must also be the first day of a billing period. If you have collected the new proposed rates, you are required to refund the excess amount collected.

An original and three (3) copies of the customer notice, notarized affidavit, and other documents referenced above must be submitted to our office by **November 8, 2013.** If these items are not received by this date, the application will be returned for failure to prosecute.

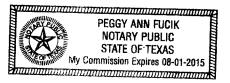

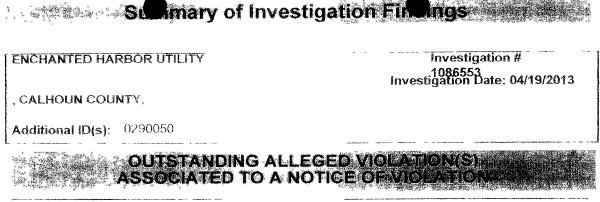
