**ORDER NO. 9  
FINDING APPLICATION INCOMPLETE AND DEFICIENT  
AND ESTABLISHING DEADLINES AND OPPORTUNITY TO CURE**

On January 5, 2016, Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) Staff filed a supplemental recommendation regarding administrative completeness of this application. Commission Staff recommended that the application of Manville Water Supply Corporation (Manville WSC) and Lakeside Water Control and Improvement District 1 (Lakeside WCID 1) (collectively the Applicants) is still deficient and not administratively complete as specifically described in Commission Staff's January 5, 2016 filing and the attached memorandum of Mary Lupo and Tracy Montes of the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division.

Consistent with Commission Staff's recommendation, this application remains administratively incomplete and deficient. Pursuant to 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 24.8(a), applications are not considered filed until a determination of administrative completeness is made, thus at this time this application is not considered filed with the Commission. On or before **February 5, 2016**, Applicants shall amend this application to cure the deficiencies noted by Commission Staff. Processing of the application cannot proceed until the requested items are received and reviewed. Applicants should not send out notice to affected parties until these discrepancies are corrected.


On or before **March 4, 2016**, Commission Staff shall file a supplemental recommendation regarding administrative completeness of the amended application and notice along with a proposed procedural schedule, if appropriate. This application was initiated in November 2013 and is not yet administratively complete. Further, this is the fourth Commission order deeming

the application deficient. Therefore, if Commission Staff's supplemental recommendation is that the application remains deficient; Commission Staff shall also comment on whether the application should be dismissed, without prejudice; allowing Applicants to re-file with a complete application.
