On January 10, 2017, PUC submitted final maps and consent forms to the City of Lyford (Applicant) and North Alamo Water Supply Corporation (NAWSC) for review and consent.

The Consent Form reflects both Docket No. 42962, Application of the City of Lyford for a Water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) in Willacy County (33790-C) and Docket No. 42963, Application of the City of Lyford for a Sewer Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) in Willacy County (33791-C).


After the telephone conference with PUC, both the City of Lyford and NAWSC did not concur with Docket No. 42962 Water CCN; however, the Applicant does concur with Docket No. 42963. NAWSC does not have any sewer in that area, however, both Dockets were listed on the same Consent Form and the City could not consent to one and not the other.

Therefore, the City is requesting not to dismiss Docket No. 42963, Application for a Sewer Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) in Willacy County (33791-C).

ORDER NO. 10
REQUIRING FILING

On February 6, 2017, Commission Staff filed a motion to dismiss the City of Lyford's application for failure to sufficiently amend the application to cure the deficiencies with the mapping documentation. Commission Staff stated that Lyford and North Alamo Water Supply Corporation did not consent to the final proposed maps and that it is unclear which sets of maps and digital data that have been filed are accurate.

On or before March 31, 2017, the City of Lyford shall file a response to Commission Staff's motion to dismiss. Failure to respond to this Order may result in dismissal of the application.
