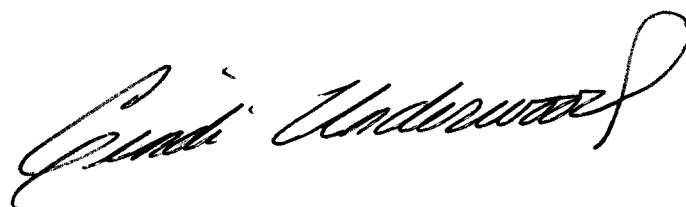

To The Honorable Commission on Environmental Quality,

I wish to put forth my objection to the City of Bonham's application to amend subject CCN Numbers.

At this time I feel that Bonham Water is not properly potable and is extremely offensive to taste and smell. Not only myself but many living within the city limits of **Bonham, Texas** feel the same and find the water objectionable and buy bottled water from local retailers. Thousands of dollars a year are spent rather than drink this water. Everyone I have spoken to who lives within the city limits do not like Bonham water, for drinking, and only use it for washing of body and clothes and dishes. Some do not even wash the dishes with it. Others complain that it is the only drinking water they can afford.

My objections to Bonham, Texas supplying our water and sewer are as follows:

The city cannot even take care of the taste and smell of the water within the present city limits. For proof we ask you to question citizens within the limits of the city yourselves and not those that are suggested to you. Better yet come and smell and taste the water for yourselves.

The city cannot take care of its present sewer and water lines.

Ask citizens within the limits of Bonham how many times streets collapse because of the aging lines collapsing or leaking. Ask folks on South 5th street about the city taking care of business concerning water and sewer.

The city lays new pavement and within a month, or so, is cutting the new pavement to repair water and sewer.

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Another reason is persistent rumors that Bonham water, when consumed regularly causes cancer and other sicknesses. One instance being the report of contaminated water in Bonham in January of 2003.

When the city can take proper care of what it has now, then I will consider them supplying me with proper water and sewer.

Until then, NO THANK YOU, I DON'T WANT THIS FOUL TASTING AND SMELLING WATER AND HAP HAZARD SUPPORT ON AN INFRASTRUCTURE THAT IS ALREADY STRAINED TO THE POINT NO BUSINESS IS WILLING TO STAY OR COME TO THE AREA.

If this objection to the above referenced CCN Numbers requires a hearing then I not only request a hearing but demand it as a citizen of a country with free choice. I further request that this hearing be held within the limits of Bonham due to a number of those having an interest in this matter not being able to afford to travel all the way to Austin for said hearing.

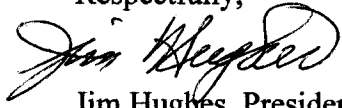

We have received a letter from you regarding CCN Nos. 11186 and 20460. We were the only ones in a neighborhood of ten who received this letter and upon checking with other people living in the area, there were very few who had received this letter; my question to you is why did only small amount of people receive this? We have asked about 150 local residents about this, and we find out of that number we have heard only 3 people who knew of the letter.

We have checked with several City of Bonham departments as well as White Shed Water trying to find out what the impact of these CCNs will be on our neighborhood, Bonham and the surrounding area. We have received different answers from each group and no one really seems to know what this is all about. We have heard the following explanations:

- From Glenn Taylor City Council, Ward 4. He talked to the City Manager and was told that this was an administration process started by a staff who had left the City, but it was only to protect the City rights to water and sewer.
- The City of Bonham is doing this to protect its water rights from outside sources coming in and supplying water to new developments
- The City of Bonham is doing this to keep developers from digging wells and not providing piping to city standards.
- From John W Burnett, City Council, Ward 1. This was only a process to help the city increase the Bonham Water Supply, by building a new lake, and maintaining control of the water. This would aid in building a larger Water Treatment plant in Bonham.
- There are plans to build a new lake in Fannin County

In regard to the sewer system, we could not get any knowledgeable answers.

We are currently with White Shed water and are very happy with it. We would appreciate it if you could explain to us what the impact of these CCNs is.

Any information you can give us will be greatly appreciated.

You will also be required to provide mailed notice to all landowners included in your proposed CCN area pursuant to commission order dated October 21, 2004. The landowner information may be obtained from the county appraisal district tax rolls for the county or counties in which the proposed CCN lies. Check the notices carefully before mailing or publishing.

As proof that notice was provided, you are required to send us the following:

- a) an original and three copies of a publisher's affidavit of the newspaper publication with tear sheets of the published notice attached;
- b) four copies of each individual notice and map sent to neighboring utilities and affected parties;
- c) one copy of each individual landowner notice and map sent landowners; and

- ✓ d) an original and three copies of the signed affidavits that individual notice to neighboring utilities, affected individuals and each landowner has been given. (Copies of the Affidavit forms are enclosed with this letter.)

Include the enclosed location map delineating the proposed service area with your individual notices to neighboring utilities, other affected parties and each landowner.

There also appears to be an overlap of your proposed service area with the certified service area of Bois Darc MUD and Ravenna Nunnelee Water Supply Corporation. Enclosed is a map showing the overlap of your proposed water CCN area with the CCN areas of Bois Darc MUD and Ravenna Nunnelee Water Supply Corporation.

Please provide written documentation on how the overlaps will be handled. There are several options to resolving this overlap. One is to amend your application by submitting revised maps and change the requested CCN area so as to not include the areas of overlap. The second option is for you to meet with Bois Darc MUD and Ravenna Nunnelee Water Supply Corporation and work out an agreement whereby Bois Darc MUD and Ravenna Nunnelee Water Supply Corporation agrees to decertification of the areas of overlap. Written documentation from Bois Darc MUD and Ravenna Nunnelee Water Supply Corporation agreeing to decertification is required. If an agreement is not reached, you would have to provide compelling evidence that Bois Darc MUD and Ravenna Nunnelee Water Supply Corporation could not provide acceptable service. The notices have been revised to propose decertification of the portions of Bois Darc MUD and Ravenna Nunnelee Water Supply Corporation in the event this is considered.

In addition to the notice requirements the following information is also necessary to proceed with your applications:

- ✓ a) Provide copies of any letters of intent from developers, landowner requests, applications for service or a combination of the above to justify the need for water and sewer service in the requested area.
- b) Indicate on a copy of a map submitted in the original applications the location of the current water and sewer connections and the requests for water and sewer service received for the proposed area.
- ✓ c) Maps submitted with the original applications are general location maps. Please, submit a large scale map such as a USGS topo map with the proposed boundary clearly identified.
- d) Please submit an accurate written description of the proposed area stating distances from roads and features, defining abstract lines and digital data in shape file or dwg format.
- e) Provide a construction cost breakdown and an estimated time line to indicate the cost and time-frame to provide water and/or sewer service to any request(s) for service received by the City of Bonham. Distinguish between water and sewer service in your response.
- ✓ f) You will also be required to provide landowners consent for all proposed area located outside the City of ~~College Station~~ *Bonham* current extraterritorial jurisdiction.

These items must be completed and returned by **October 21, 2005**. Processing of these applications cannot proceed until the close of the 30 day public comment period which begins after all the required notices
