Dear Mr. Newson:

The above referenced application, received on September 13, 2013, has been assigned Application No. 37725-S, but has not been accepted for filing. Please refer to the application number in future correspondence.

In order for your application to be accepted for filing, you must submit four (4) copies of the following items:

- 1. The seller's most recent inspection report letter. For each system deficiency listed, if any, attach a brief explanation listing the actions taken or being taken to correct the listed deficiencies, including the proposed completion dates.
- 2. The neighboring utility list in your application is incomplete. Please note, on November 14, 2012 the Commission implemented a policy change that requires applicants for CCN related applications to provide a complete list of entities providing the same type of retail utility service (i.e., water and/or sewer) as requested in the application, within a specified area. The list should include all retail public utilities, counties, districts and groundwater conservation districts, and cities whose corporate limits and/or extra-

territorial jurisdiction (ETJ) are within the same two mile area of the proposed CCN area. Please make sure your list is complete. Incomplete lists will result in the return of your application.

In addition, Cheyenne Hills Water Supply owes Public Health Services fees for fiscal years 2012 and 2013 in the amount of \$142.10. Payment may be made through the following methods: cash, check, ACH (electronic check), money order, or credit card through TCEQ's electronic payment portal (e-pay). Upon payment, please send documentation reflecting payment of all delinquent fees and penalties.

Please be advised: Failure to pay fees/penalties within 30 days will result in additional administrative actions affecting your fee accounts and your application with TCEQ. With respect to fees and/or penalties, these actions may include enforcement and collections efforts to recover the debt owed to the state. Regarding your permit application, additional administrative actions may include return of your application (forfeiting the application fee), or a contested case hearing that may result in the denial of your application.

Processing for the above referenced application cannot proceed and notices cannot be mailed until we receive these items. These items must be completed and returned to our office by **December 13, 2013**. If we do not receive the requested information by this date, your application will be returned for failure to prosecute.
