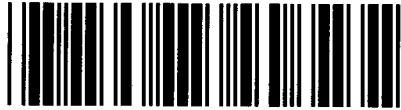

Inline Development LLC Applications for Water and Sewer Rate Increases**

Introduction: Mr. George Gogonas, Utility Rates Analyst, has provided significant help to us in our efforts to prepare a correct set of applications and to respond to PUC questions and comments. We have received several PUC notices regarding our application for a water rate increase. Some had Docket No. 43069 and some had Docket No. 43083 on their headings. The last PUC letter was stamp dated October 6, 2014. It contains a summary of the notices, therefore we are responding to it as completely as we can. We have presented the PUC statements in bold text and then followed it with our response in normal font.

1. Specifically, Inline Development LLC's (Inline's) application (1) failed to complete the affidavit and provide proper notice to appropriate parties affecting the rate change.

We have revised the "Notice of Proposed Rate Change (TCEQ form 10423) to better show the amounts of the changes and their proposed effective dates. We have also included on the last page of this notice a letter from Inline to the customers explaining the small pass-through rate increase. The proper rate change notice has been sent to Inline's customers in the past few days. The required Affidavit has been signed by Mr. Michael Martz, Owner of Inline Development, LLC and has been notarized. A listing of all customers notified, along with a copy of the affidavit is being sent to the PUC since all notifications have been completed. Also a copy of the notice and the affidavit was sent to the PUC on October 17, 2014 and another updated copy is attached to this letter.

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2. "Failed to provide the 12-month test year period regarding the costs to the utility of providing water and sewer service information."

The test year used was January 1 to December 31, 2013. Detailed financial data is contained in the Water and Wastewater Utilities Annual Report of Inline Development LLC for the calendar year ended December 31, 2013. This report contains a breakdown of revenues and expenses for the year, number of water and wastewater connections, debt information, water and wastewater production consumption and treatment, and many other important facts essential to the rate change application. A copy of that annual report was submitted to the PUC as an attachment to our application and another copy is also included with this letter.

3. "Contains discrepancies in the rate of return for both the water and sewer long term debt and equity information."

The Long Term Debt and Equity Information for water is contained in Section IV on page 11 and for sewer is contained in Section IV on page 23 of the Rate Change Application. Section IV of the application has instructions which state "Note: You may choose to use the Rate of Return Worksheet which is attached to the Instructions." We marked an X in this box to indicate that this was our choice. Section IV also requested information about the Company's Equity and Rate of Return. We filled out Section IV, but some of the data entered appeared to have been incorrectly entered by us. We have therefore redone Section IV and related forms and have also provided here a detailed explanation of our entries.

Our client, Mr. Michael Martz, has owned and operated the subject water and sewer facilities for a very long time. He is also the owner of the residential areas for which the water and sewer systems serve. He does not wish to publicize the amounts of his investments and the amounts that he owes. This choice of his can be seen on the rate change forms and instructions, especially in the Rate of Return Worksheet attached to the TCEQ's Application Instructions. Overall, it is clear that the failure of the client to provide data regarding his total equity in the water and wastewater systems and his depreciation expenses directly affects the amount he can charge his customers for their water and wastewater services. We explained this to the client and he indicated to us that he would prefer to charge his clients less than to increase the rates to be charged by publicizing his investments in his water and wastewater services.

We have therefore chosen the authorized option under Section IV B. Rate of Return that states “NOTE: You may choose to use the Rate of Return Worksheet which is attached to the instructions.”

We do note that we may have previously erroneously entered some data in Section IV and in the Worksheets. We will explain the errors here and have reentered the data correctly.

Section IV Equity. We entered the company’s total equity here based upon the amount owed on the major site property loan, but should have entered the total for the water system on page 11 and the total for the wastewater system in item A Equity on page 23. We entered 40% of the total loan for the water system and 60% of the total loan for the wastewater system. We then properly completed subsections D. and E. for both the water and wastewater systems.

Completion of the Rate of Return Worksheet

This worksheet is Appendix A of TCEQ’s Rate/Tariff Change Instructions form listed as TCEQ form 10423-inst (09/06/12). It is used to calculate the percentage rate of return the applicants can be authorized to charge their water and sewer customers. We used this worksheet to calculate our authorized rate of return for the original application which we submitted last month.

The Baa Public Utility Bond Averaged that was Used

The first step in completing the worksheet says to contact TCEQ and obtain the most current Baa Public Utility Bond Average. We did contact TCEQ for our original application last month and received the value of 5%. Now when I called the number provided, I received the response that I should call PUC at number 512-936-7166. I have been calling that number for 2 days and do not get anything but a voicemail message. I therefore propose using the percentage value received from the TCEQ last month which was 5%.

I also note that the Bloomberg News had this headline today, October 22, 2014; “Utility Bears at Five-Year High as Bond Yields Increase.” Therefore the 5% value we received last month is very likely to be a good and reasonable value for the current bond yield value that we would

receive from the PUC if we could get an answer today. We have attached a copy of the rate of return used to determine our current rate of return. The worksheet shows that our allowed rate of return for both water and sewer services remain at 11%.

Corrections to the Application Pages

During our review of the Rate Changes Application, we made a number of changes to correct the errors we have found. These changes are explained as follows.

1. Page 10 of 41

Original Cost & Depreciation Schedule – Water. The footnote we entered has been changed to “No net book value claimed due to age of system.” The client does not wish to claim depreciation expenses even though this reduces the amount he can charge for water services.

2. Page 11 of 41

A. Equity: The amount listed has been changed to \$724,593 as the equity total for the Water System. This represents 40% of the total the client owes of the total reported Notes Payable.

3. Page 12 of 41

Corrections have been made to reflect changes that were made in the preceding item.

4. Page 13 of 41

Corrections have been made to reflect the 11% Rate of Return expected rather than the 9.5% cost of the loan.

5. Page 14 of 41

Numerous corrections have been made due to the changes in Tables III and IV. The changes made have in all cases reduced the revenue requirements for next year as well as the proposed amount of the rate changes.

6. Page 23 of 41

A. Equity: The total capital the company has in the sewer system is listed as \$1,086,884 which is 60% of the total amount owed of the notes payable. (We have calculated the cost ratio of the sewer and water systems as a 60/40 split based on our previous experience and our review of each expense item.)

7. Page 24 of 41

The sewer portion of the debt is shown. We have also added to our footnote; "The client does not wish to publicize the total amount he has invested in the combined system.

8. Page 25 of 41

The calculated Rate of Return from the worksheet was entered rather than the payment interest rate which increased the planned return and increased the interest rate and also caused income tax to be payable.

9. Page 26 of 41

We summed line F onto column 3 and entered the income tax amount.

Explanation of Rate of Return Used

Section 10 of the water application allows the applicant to calculate a water billing rate structure that recovers the revenue requirement with rates the applicant believes is more appropriate to its customers.

The owner applicant prefers not to publicize the amount invested in the water and sewer services, nor the amount of income taxes paid for any of these services. Further, since the facilities have been operating for many years, the owner does not wish to publicize the current value of the properties and equipment that still needs to be depreciated. He therefore wishes to use the Table X.A. "Alternative Method of Rate Design" to present the proposed water rates that is fair to customers and to his investment. This is, of course, in accordance with the guidelines of TCEQ's Application for the Rate/Tariff Change; TCEQ Form 10423 dated April 2013. The calculations are explained as follows: Table X.A. Line D Total Revenue Requirement. This amount is to cover water expenses, plus 11% of the amount invested in the water services. 2013 water expenses were \$262,468. Amount invested is not to be reported, however, the amount currently owed is reported in Section 5 of the 2013 Annual Utility Report as \$1,811,482. The portion of this loan for water services is 40%. We have shown on the "Rate of Return Worksheet," that a Rate of Return of 11.0% is appropriate. This amount of 40% of \$1,811,482 times 11% is: $\$1,811,482 \times 0.40 = 724,592 \times 11.0\% = 79,705$. Applying this to the 2013 water expenses of \$252,221 it is shown that the total revenue requirement is 331,926. This number is applied to Table X.A.

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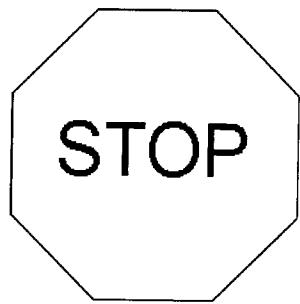

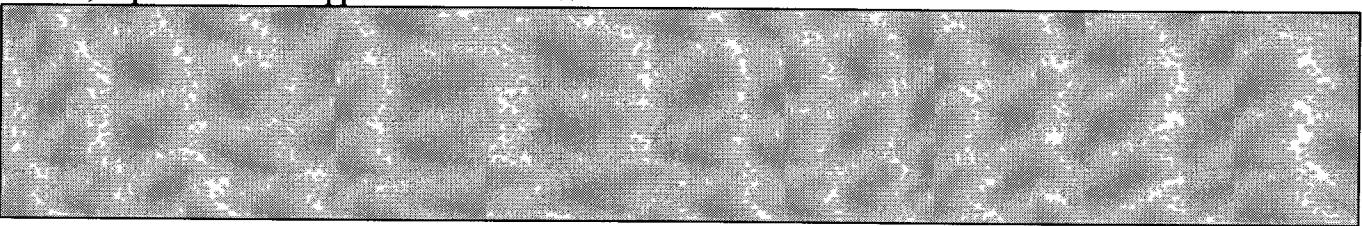

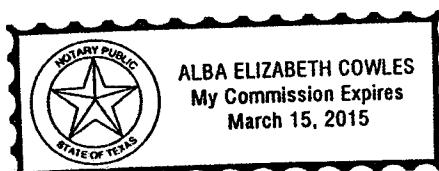
