NOTICE OF APPROVAL

This Notice addresses the application of the City of Midlothian and Mountain Peak Special Utility District for approval to transfer certain certificate rights and to singly certificate an area that has been dually certificated in Ellis County. Commission Staff recommended approval of the application. The application is approved.

The Commission adopts the following findings of fact and conclusions of law:

I. Findings of Fact

Procedural History and Background

- On October 30, 2008, Midlothian and Mountain Peak filed with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) an application for the sale, transfer, or merger (STM) of certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) rights in Ellis County.
- 2. Midlothian holds CCN NO. 11706.
- 3. Mountain Peak holds CCN No. 10908.
- 4. On August 4, 2009, the TCEQ sought clarifications from the applicants regarding whether they actually wanted the application to be processed as STM, or as a Tex. Water Code § 13.248 (TWC) contract.
- 5. On August 29, 2009, Mountain peak stated that the application should be processed pursuant to TWC § 13.248; Midlothian concurred on September 30, 2009.
- 6. Proposed amended certificates, maps and consents were provided by TCEQ to applicants, however, no final approval of the application was issued by TCEQ.

- 7. Effective September 1, 2014, the economic regulation of water and sewer utilities was transferred from the TCEQ to the Commission. This application was part of the transfer and is now under Commission jurisdiction.
- 8. On August 21, 2015, Order No. 1 was issued, requiring Commission Staff to file an update on the status of the application, a recommendation on the need for a hearing or on final disposition of the application or propose a procedural schedule.
- 9. On September 14, 2015, Order No. 2 was issued, requiring clarification from the applicants regarding the intent of the application and requiring applicants to provide proof of the notice that was issued in this application, including a sample and accompanying map.
- 10. On October 19, 2015, Order No. 3 was issued, requiring applicants to provide proposed notice and a proposed list of recipients for Commission Staff to review and requiring Commission Staff to provide a recommendation or additional procedural schedule 20 days after the issuance of a Notice in Docket Nos. 42928 and 44030, both of which involved applications under TWC § 13.248, and therefore would provide clarification regarding the requirements for processing this application.
- 11. On January 19, 2016 and January 25, 2016, the City and Mountain Peak respectively, consented to the portion of the map prepared by Commission Staff that shows the areas affected by this application, but not the remainder of the map.
- 12. On February 12, 2016, Commission Staff recommended approval of the application and further recommended that based on the number of affected customers, the length of time those customers have been being served by the applicants and the age of this application notice be waived, for good cause. Commission Staff provided proposed revised certificates and a map of the amended service areas for CCN Nos. 11706 and 10908.
- 13. The revised map and certificates discussed in Findings of Fact No. 11 and 12 are attached to this Notice.
- 14. On February 25, 2016, Order No. 7 was issued, clarifying and confirming that the application has been and is being treated as an application under TWC § 13.248, but that it will not be restyled, and waiving notice, for good cause.

- 15. Commission Staff determined that Midlothian and Mountain Peak have the financial capability to provide continuous and adequate service to their respective proposed service areas.
- 16. Commission Staff recommended that approval of this application is necessary for the service, accommodation, convenience and safety of the public.
- 17. On April 6, 2016, a joint proposed notice of approval and request to evidence were filed in this proceeding.

Evidentiary Record

18. On June 13, 2016, Order No. 9 was issued, admitting evidence into the record of this proceeding.

Description of the Transaction

19. The purpose of the application is to effectuate an agreement between the applicants that would result in the transfer of approximately 119-acres, that had 3 existing customers when this application was filed in 2008, and immediately adjoining lands from Midlothian's certificated service area to Mountain Peak; and to decertify from Mountain Peak and singly-certificate to Midlothian an approximately 43-acre area that had no existing customers when this application was filed in 2008 and that is currently dually-certificated. \(\)

Informal Disposition

- 20. More than 15 days have passed since notice was waived in this application.
- 21. The City, Mountain Peak, and Commission Staff are the only parties to this proceeding.
- 22. No complaints, motions to intervene, or requests for hearing were filed that have not been dealt with.
- 23. No issues of fact or law are disputed by any party; therefore, no hearing is necessary.

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II. Conclusions of Law

- 1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to TWC § 13.248.
- 2. Midlothian and Mountain Peak are retail public utilities as defined in TWC § 13.002(19) and 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 24.3(58).
- 3. Notice of this application was waived, for good cause.
- 4. Midlothian has demonstrated that is has adequate financial, managerial, and technical capability to provide continuous and adequate service to its customers in the proposed service area in Ellis County.
- 5. Mountain Peak has demonstrated that is has adequate financial, managerial, and technical capability to provide continuous and adequate service to its customers in the proposed service area in Ellis County.
- 6. Midlothian and Mountain Peak have demonstrated that the transfer of certificated service area and decertification/single certification requested in this application are necessary for the service, accommodation, convenience, and safety of the public.
- 7. Under TWC § 13.257(r) and 16 TAC § 24.106(f), Midlothian and Mountain Peak are both required to record a certified copy of their approved CCN and map, along with a boundary description of the service area, in the real property records of each county in which the service area or a portion of the service area is located, and submit to the Commission evidence of the recording.
- 8. The requirements for informal disposition pursuant to 16 TAC § 22.35 have been met in this proceeding.

III. Ordering Paragraphs

In accordance with these findings of fact and conclusions of law, the Commission issues the following Order:

1. The application is approved.

- Midlothian's CCN No. 11706 is amended consistent with this notice, to reflect (1) removal 2. and transfer to Mountain Peak of an approximately 119-acre portion of its certificated service and (2) single certification of an approximately 43-acre portion of its certificated service area that was previously dually certificated with Mountain Peak.
- Midlothian shall serve every customer and applicant for service within water CCN 3. No. 11706, and such service shall be continuous and adequate.
- Midlothian shall comply with the recording requirements in TWC § 13.257(r) for the area 4. in Ellis County affected by the petition and submit to the Commission evidence of the recording no later than 31 days after receipt of this Notice.
- Mountain Peak's CCN No. 10908 is amended consistent with this notice, to reflect (1) 5. addition and transfer from Midlothian of approximately 119 acres of certificated service area and (2) decertification of an approximately 43-acre portion of its certificated service area that was dually certificated to Mountain Peak and the City and is now singly certificated to the City.
- Mountain Peak shall serve every customer and applicant for service within water CCN 6. No. 10908, and such service shall be continuous and adequate.
- Mountain Peak shall comply with the recording requirements in TWC § 13.257(r) for the 7. area in Ellis County affected by the petition and submit to the Commission evidence of the recording no later than 31 days after receipt of this Notice.
- 8. All other motions, requests for entry of specific findings of fact or conclusions of law, and any other requests for general or specific relief, if not expressly granted herein, are hereby denied.


