Ed,

Thank you for sending us your questions about the hot water issues.

Well it sounds like there needs to be some extra "cooler air" circulating into the stream of water entering these tanks.

Question: Does the water go into only one tank and then equalize into the other from the bottom? If so then you may want to consider installing a diffuser onto the discharge pipe into that single tank. You could do this on both tanks but if all the hot water goes into one tank then that gives the water a bit more "detention time" to move down that first tank and then into the second tank.

For the extended "detention time" you'd also need to have all the "discharged" water to the booster pumps be coming from this "second" tank.

The diffuser would allow for the water to be sprayed into the top of the first tank and thereby hopefully cooling it a bit more than just dumping a full pipe stream into one or both tanks. These type diffusers can be purchased or manufactured for your specific volume of water. Typically these diffusers would begin maybe around \$500.00 according to size pipe and volume on up to several thousand dollars. Then there'd be the expense of installing it as well.

With the other tank out of service for you to be able to install any type diffuser another tank would have to be out of service for a short while which would cycle the hot water through the single tank way too fast for any cooling to take place.

Speaking of installation: Does the "inlet" pipe at the top of the tank have a regular threaded steel ell? If so how close is it to the top man-way? If it is relatively close to the hatch, then the diffuser could be screwed into it "maybe" from outside the tank while the wells are not pumping. Just a thought as I don't know what the piping configuration is for your tanks.

One of the most common ways to cool water is to let it flow through an cooling tower or aerator which is located either on top of one of the tanks or on the ground and then piped so that the discharged water could be directed to either of the three tanks which was not out of service for repairs.

You'd stated the system doesn't have much extra money right now for a "turn-key" cooling tower or refrigeration unit to be installed. You may check with your engineer or tank suppliers to see if they may have a "back up" unit which they know of that can be rented for a few weeks or a month until the other tank gets finished.

IDEA: while this tank is down you may be able to get a diffuser of some kind installed in it now for the next time one of the other tanks are out of service. It will not help with the current hot water problem but it'd be ready for any future tank repairs.

Lastly the only other thing I can think of would be if one or both remaining tanks have dual vents at the tops of the tanks. Normally this is for the typical venting when the water is either filling or being discharged from the tanks. If there are at least two vents per tank then filtered air could be blown into or withdrawn from the tops of these tanks. This would remove accumulated hot air which is sitting on the water surface. By removing this hot air it may decrease the water temp a few degrees as well.

I'm going to send your dilemma to some other TRWA Staff who may have alternate inexpensive ideas to cool the hot water coming into and out of these other two tanks.

Unfortunately I don't know of any free aerators or cooling towers.

One other idea comes to mind and that is for the system to rent an inflatable tank to allow for even more detention time similar to having the other tank in service which allows the heat to dissipate to an acceptable level.

USDA has some "emergency" grant/loan funds but typically these funds are for instances where the well breaks down. But it'd be worth a phone call to USDA Rural Development in Temple to see if they could get you some of this emergency funding.

Hopefully some of our other folks will have some other ideas that are not too expensive.

Sorry I couldn't be of more assistance.

Hello Larry,

This is our first time to contact you and I'm not sure you are the proper authority to answer this question, but if you are not the one, perhaps you can direct this to the proper authority.

We get our water from our owned well at about 3000-3200 feet in the Trinity Aquifer, and we serve about 335 water connections, some quite close to the well and others up to several miles away. Our problem is with the customers close (up to several thousand feet) to our production area. The water furnished to them is too hot for them to use directly from the faucet. It is too hot for a shower or to wash their hands. The water is produced at our well, then placed in a storage tank (we have two 65,000 gallon tanks, and one 125,000 gallon tank) until it is used. When we don't have all 3 tanks available, we have the problem I mentioned. Presently we have one tank out of service pending an internal refinishing.

Can you offer any ideas about how we can make the water more temperate for the near-by customers, without spending a lot of money we don't have?

Any assistance will be greatly appreciated.

Hello,

We recently received lead and copper samples for the Avalon WSC water system and after review we could not accept what was sent in. Three of the locations that were sampled and reported do not match the sample locations that are currently in our database. If the sample locations were the same locations that were sampled they may be jumbled around according to their LCR number and would have to resubmit a corrected Tap Sample Submission Form with the correct listing, the analytical lab report received from the lab, and a letter on the system's letterhead signed by the highest level of management with the system explaining what happened. If the locations sampled are not a part of the system's sampling pool the system will have to resample each time this is the case. The compliance period for reduced sampling ends September 30 so you have until then to physically take the resamples and the data needs to be in our database no later than 10 days after. The system was supposed to check their sampling sites via Drinking Water Watch and send in an updated Site Selection Form before the system was able to sample. This was in the instructions for lead and copper this year but would need to be done now if it hasn't been done yet this year. This form would have to include any and all sites already in the database (Drinking Water Watch) in the exact same order as they appear even if the system does not sample a site anymore. We cannot simply change LCR numbers because that would change the system's history of sampling so any new site you wish to change to will have to be added to the bottom of the sampling pool. The biggest thing to keep in mind with the sample sites is that no matter what the LCR numbers and addresses have to match. If a sample location is no longer there or will never be sampled again you can choose to inactive a site by filling out the Address Change / Inactivation form that lets us know that the site will never be sampled from again for some reason. There is a link to Drinking Water Watch below in my signature and if you need any help navigating the site to get to your sites you can certainly call or email me and I would be glad to be of further assistance.

CONSENT AGENDA:

CPA is working on audit but had issues with recorded minutes. We are working on transcribing disc in a re-cap form for her to review. Annual Consumer Confidence Report that was required to be mailed by July 1, was completed and mailed June 26, 2015. Extra copies available for anyone. Received another notice of violation concerning the Locational Running Annual Average for trihalomethanes requiring another notice be submitted. Sample taken on April 27, 2015, was below the standard limit but not low enough to bring the LRAA below standard because of the high ones taken in July 2014 and March 2015. The next sample to be taken for the 3rd quarter of 2015 should replace the high July 2014 sample and eliminate the issue.


Discussion of operator licensing process. Discussion about removal of
