The success of the negotiations depends on the flexibility and good-faith efforts of the participants, as well as their understanding that compromise and creative thinking often play essential roles in reaching a settlement agreement. Mediation participants usually must have some expectation of compromising in order to reach a resolution. However, a big advantage of the mediation process is that the parties are free in a mediation to expand on ways to resolve the parties' issues with the application that are completely outside the Commission's jurisdiction. No party's legal rights are affected by mere participation in mediation. A mediated settlement agreement requires the consent of all parties. If any party wishes to discontinue settlement discussions at any time, the party is free to do so knowing that his or her legal rights in this matter have not been impaired in any way.

Please note also that in an effort to encourage people to negotiate in earnest and to talk openly during the mediation process, all communications (including all phone, email and fax communications either with the mediator or between the parties themselves) made by participants during and leading up to a mediation meeting are, by law, to be kept confidential and cannot be disclosed to outside persons. These described communications also are protected from disclosure to other persons or offices within the TCBQ or SOAH (i.e., TCEQ's Office of the Chief Clerk or SOAH's Docketing Clerk, via filing or other correspondence). I would ask that any party who has any question related to the important confidentiality prohibition please contact me to discuss the matter.

I also want to provide a brief summary of the Commission's hearing procedures for this type of application so that the parties know what to expect if this matter does not settle. The next step in the Commission's process is for the matter to be acheduled for the Commission's consideration of whether or not to grant the hearing requests and/or the requests for reconsideration. Once this matter is scheduled for a Commission Agenda meeting, the Applicant, the Executive Director, and the Office of Public interest Counsel will have the opportunity to file written responses and the requesters may file written replies. In making the determination of whether to grant the hearing requests, the Commission must determine whether or not the requesters are "affected persons" under the rules and whether or not they raised relevant and material issues concerning the application. If the Commission grants a hearing request, the Commission will refer the relevant and material issues for a contested case hearing at SOAH. The Applicant will have the burden of proof on the referred issues and any protesting parties (assuming you formally seek and are granted party status at the preliminary hearing) would have the opportunity to challenge the Applicant's evidence. If we do not schedule a mediation and informally resolve the dispute, SOAH will issue a notice of hearing; which essentially is the formal notification of the time and date of the preliminary hearing. However, the first hearing will not be the only event to occur in this matter. At the preliminary hearing, the Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") will take formal jurisdiction over the matter (assuming the notices are correct), name the parties that can participate in the hearing, and potentially rule on any formal motions that may have been filed or asserted the day of the hearing. In order to be granted party status, most ALJs require that the entities seeking such status attend the preliminary hearing and formally participate. The ALJ will establish a procedural schedule that involves a discovery period, the filing of pre-filed testimony for the parties' direct cases, an evidentiary hearing, and the issuance of a proposal for decision that must be considered by the Commission. The ALJ will explain the

parties' legal rights and obligations at the preliminary hearing and in the subsequent order establishing the procedural schedule. Failure to meet those obligations may result in sanctions issued by the ALJ concerning a party's further participation in the hearing. Many contested case hearings take nine months to over a year until a final Commission decision is reached. The following is a link to SOAH's website generally explaining the hearing procedures: http://www.soah.state.tx.us/not-an-attorney/hearings.asp.

I hope this letter has provided a helpful introduction to the Commission's ADR Program and how it may assist the potential parties at this point in the hearing process. I respectfully ask that the Applicant and Ms. Gillespie please contact me via telephone or email to discuss whether mediation is an option you wish to pursue at this time. If you are interested in mediation, the next step will be to discuss your availabilities for a mediation date. I would anticipate allowing for a full day of negotiations. Because mediation is a voluntary process, both the Applicant and Ms. Gillespie must agree to participate before I may schedule a mediation. If the potential parties have already begun to formulate some potential solutions to the issues raised by the requesters, I am happy to assist the parties in facilitating informal settlement discussions. However, if either the Applicant or Ms. Gillespie prefers to move forward with the Commission's regular process instead of attempting to negotiate a resolution of the issues concerning the application at this time, I will cease the current ADR efforts and this matter will be scheduled for the Commission's consideration of whether or not to grant the hearing request. The decision whether or not to participate in ADR efforts is to remain confidential and not disclosed to the Commission or ALJ because ADR is a voluntary, optional process.

Please do not hesitate to contact me if you have any questions. I look forward to potentially working with the potential parties in seeking a collaborative resolution of this dispute.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED REVISIONS TO 30 TAC CHAPTER 307

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (commission) will conduct a public hearing to receive testimony regarding proposed revisions to 30 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) Chapter 307, Texas Surface Water Quality Standards, §§307.2 - 307.4 and 307.6 - 307.10, under the requirements of Texas Government Code, Chapter 2001, Subchapter B. The proposed rulemaking would provide a periodic public review and revision of the Texas Surface Water Quality Standards, as provided for in the Texas Water Code, §26.023, and as required by the Federal Clean Water Act, §303(c).

The commission proposes substantive and editorial changes, the addition of a definition for industrial cooling water areas, clarification regarding the allowance of different mixing zone sizes for specific numeric criteria, and to designate site-specific criteria for:

1) eight additional streams in Appendix D; 2) two additional site-specific toxic criteria in Appendix E; and 3) 11 additional site-specific criteria in Appendix G of §307.10.

The commission will hold a public hearing on this proposal in in Austin on October 17, 2013 at 10:00 a.m. in Building R, Room 2015, at the commission's central office located at 12100 Park 35 Circle. The hearing is structured for the receipt of oral or written comments by interested persons. Individuals may present oral statements when called upon in order of registration. Open discussion will not be permitted during the hearing; however, commission staff members will be available to discuss the proposal 30 minutes prior to the hearing.

Persons who have special communication or other accommodation needs who are planning to attend the hearing should contact Sandy Wong, Office of Legal Services at (512) 239-1802. Requests should be made as far in advance as possible.

To Avalon Water Supply & Sewer Service Corp. Directors:

Our next meeting will be Nov. 14th.

At this time there are 2 important items to discuss:

- Drought Contingency Plan-This is to be approved annually and has not been done in the past
 year. I am unaware of any changes needed, so we just need someone to move to approve the
 Drought Contingency Plan as it was last year, get a second and vote for it.
- 2. According to the by-laws, our annual meeting should be on the second Monday in March, which will be March 10*, 2014. Since actions start 75 days prior to the meeting, that means things start at approximately December 12** At the first meeting after the new directors were installed last, they should have established a Credentials Committee consisting of the Secretary/Treasurer who is the chair person, one other board member, and one other person who is a member. The minutes do not reveal this was done therefore it must be done immediately. Please be prepared to handle this matter.

We have found that some records have been changed, so that what is showing as the owner is actually a renter. We must complete a survey of all accounts prior to 12/12/13 so that we will have an accurate list of eligible voters for the mailing that takes place then. If any of you know of any instances of someone renting, please let me know so we can make sure the records are correct. We must have in the office at that time an up-to-date list of all members with addresses and phone numbers (if available) for anyone who wishes to see or copy them.

We need at least 35 votes in order to hold a valid election, so be prepared to solicit proxies.

TCEQ. I will send it in another e-mail as that will be easier than trying to attach it to this. The hearing on 11/20 is actually a hearing to see if Gillespie gets a hearing in front of an administrative judge, but in reading the attached, and after talking to the author, Vic McWherter, I feel sure she will get a hearing. I asked Mr. McWherter if we should have an attorney with us for the first hearing and he said most of the time both sides have legal counsel, so that if and when it goes to a court hearing, the attorney will be familiar with the situation. You directors need to talk among yourselves and determine if you want counsel, and if so, who you want to represent you. YOU MUST SELECT COUNSEL, IF YOU WANT ONE. After you select one, if you desire, I will contact him and bring him up to date. Quick action is necessary in order to give him time to get up to date on everything that has happened.

Board Members:

While our finances have improved since July, keep in mind that there is no compensation being paid to either Jan or myself. This is our preference and we have no desire to change it, however neither do we expect to be here indefinitely. Therefore you must plan for our replacements.

Furthermore we have several substantial expenses on the horizon. First is the repair of well #2. That could be anywhere from \$15,000 to \$40,000 depending on how we choose to do it.

Secondly, there will be unknown expenses in connection with our TCEQ hearing and resolution. I have no idea what that will be, but at the very least there will be an attorney's cost. Probably there will be some expense for correcting the effluent situation and perhaps a cost of purchasing an additional right of way from Gillespie.

Also TCEQ is expecting us to establish a plan for determining which of our sewer lines need replacing and how we plan to handle that matter. Documentation from Hilco in the past indicates the USDA, which has been our best source of funds in the past, says the sewer part of the system should be self-sustaining before granting any additional funding.

We also need to consider an additional vehicle since we now have 2 employees in the field.

We need to do some replacement fencing at the waste water plant and at the lift station per TCEQ requirements. We also need to buy several new tools for field use. There are several other items that need to be addressed, that can be brought up later

The purpose of this is to bring up our income. We are treading water right now, but that can't continue. We must have more income and the sewer system must contribute more to the income. Therefore I am proposing a rate increase as follows:

Base water rate of \$40.00 and a base sewer rate of \$45.00. The tiered gallonage pricing will remain the same at this time except for higher users where the tiered pricing will be raised as follows

1000 Gal	Included	
9000 Gal	54 60 per thousand	
10,000 Gai	\$4.85 per thousand	
20,000 Gal	\$5.10 per thousand	from here up is what is in place
30,000 Gal	\$5.35 per thousand	from here down is proposed
40,000 Gal	\$5.60 per thousand	
50,000 and above	\$5.85 per thousand	

While this may be distasteful, the fact remains that we must have more income to continue operating. I think we are operating about as economically as we can. I am open to any suggestions, but at this time, this is my best recommendation.

Mi Ed,

I wanted to touch base with you before I send Avalon's preferred scope for the mediation to the Gillespies. I noted that the two attachments had very different focuses: 1) easement concerns going forward and 2) past allegations raised by the Gillespies at Board meetings. The two issues concerning the easements are good additional issues to discuss. At this point, I would recommend that the issues list that Avalon sends have slightly less detail in an effort to maintain Avalon's negotiating flexibility. Highlighting the general issue you would like to address is important.

I do have a word of caution after reading the attached PFD document that lists complaints about allegations made by the Gillespies. Participants in the ADR process need to focus on several concepts to increase the likelihood of reaching a collaborative settlement. One of the most important in situations like the one between Avalon and the Gillespies is the parties need to maintain a future mindset. Participants often become fixated and angry over past communications and proving that the other side has been unreasonable at past meetings. A mediated settlement agreement can establish the framework for the parties' interactions as neighboring landowners into the future; however, the agreement can never alter how a party acted in the past. I know that past interactions often frame the reasons for the current dispute, but I just want to make sure that Avalon's representative at any mediation keep in mind this important concept. No one at the mediation will be making a determination of who was right and who was wrong at past situations, so focusing issues on past allegations will probably not lead to a resolution. A better focus the issues in the allegations document may be coming up with ways to promote better communication or procedures at the Board meetings.

In attempting to help Avalon frame its issues, am I correct that you desire to look at the following:

- Resolving the Gillespies' protest of the application and obtaining the amended TPDES permit;
- The size and location of an easement over the Gillespie property to better facilitate access and repair to the facility;
- 3) The ability to remove vegetation from the easement and plant grass in its place;
- More productive communications during Board meetings between Board members and the Gillespies;
- 5) Better methods to directly address Gillespie complaints.

Please let me know what you think or if you have different language or issues you would like to submit. I drafted these issues by making assumptions from your information, so please correct them as needed.

I will go ahead and forward you desire to not join in any continuance request of the Agenda setting to the Gillespies

The draft preliminary recommendation contains the Texas Water Development Board Executive Administrator's proposed recommendation to the Board members of the Texas Water Development Board to resolve the interregional conflict between the 2011 Region C and Region D regional water plans by instructing the Region C Regional Water Planning Group to readopt its current regional water plan with Marvin Nichols Reservoir as a recommended water management strategy and instructing the Region D Regional Water Planning Group to amend its plan to reflect that the conflict has been resolved.
