**COMPLAINANT GILLESPIE'S VERIFIED BRIEF IN RESPONSE TO  
ORDER NO. 6**

**TO THE HONORABLE JUDGES STEPHANIE FRAZEE AND TRAVIS  
VICKERY:**

COMES NOW, Carol D. Gillespie ("Gillespie" or "Complainant") and files this Verified Brief in Response to Order No. 6 and in support of which Complainant respectfully shows the following:

**I. BACKGROUND**

1. On July 14, 2014, Carol D. Gillespie filed her original complaint against Avalon Water Supply and Sewer Services Corporation (AWSSSC) with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("TCEQ"), which complaint was supplemented by additional complaint letters and other information on August 14, 2014, August 20, 2014, September 30, 2014, October 6, 2014, and February 3, 2015.

2. After jurisdiction was transferred to the Public Utility Commission of Texas ("Commission") on September 1, 2014, Ms. Gillespie's complaint was referred to the State Office of Administrative Hearings ("SOAH") for hearing on January 25, 2016.

3. SOAH Order No. 2 was issued on March 18, 2016, establishing a hearing schedule.

4. On March 22, 2016, the Commission issued a Preliminary Order establishing a list of issues to be addressed in the hearing before SOAH, including whether AWSSSC was failing to comply with Texas Water Code §§ 13.002, 13.004 and 67.007 (“TWC”).

5. On April 21, 2016, after the parties moved jointly to abate this proceeding for settlement negotiations, Order No. 3 was issued abating the discovery and hearing schedule until a status report was filed on May 20, 2016.

6. After various status reports and abatements, AWSSSC filed a Motion to Dismiss and Alternate Motion to Certify Question and Continue Temporary Abatement of Discovery and Hearing Schedule (“Motions to Dismiss and Certify Question”) on June 17, 2016.

10. On June 24, 2016, Complainant filed a Response to Avalon Water Supply and Sewer Services Corporation’s Motions to Dismiss and Certify Question.

11. On July 7, 2016, Order No. 6 was issued requiring Gillespie to file a verified brief by July 22, 2016 setting forth alleged deficiencies, which form the basis of her complaint and invoke the Commission’s jurisdiction. This response brief is timely filed.

## **II. DISCUSSION**

As set out in Complainant’s Response to Avalon Water Supply and Sewer Services Corporation’s Motions to Dismiss and Certify Question and its earlier Motion to Compel answers to her second requests for information,<sup>1</sup> Complainant showed that jurisdiction was proper if AWSSSC violated its bylaws and the Texas Open Meetings Act (“TOMA”). That is, PUC has jurisdiction to treat AWSSSC like any other water and sewer utility – with original rate jurisdiction and authority to dissolve the board and appoint a receiver among other things – if AWSSSC failed to conduct elections properly or failed to comply with its bylaws – violations of either of the TWC § 13.004(a)

subsections.<sup>2</sup>

Section 13.004(a) states that the Commission has the same jurisdiction over a water supply or sewer service corporation (“WSC”) if the Commission finds the WSC:

- (1) is failing to conduct annual or special meetings in compliance with Section 67.007; or
- (2) is operating in a manner that does not comply with the requirements for classifications as a nonprofit water supply or sewer service corporation prescribed by Sections 13.002 (11) and (24).<sup>3</sup>

The Water Code goes on to define a water supply or sewer service corporation in Section 13.002(24):

(24) "Water supply or sewer service corporation" means **a nonprofit corporation organized and operating under Chapter 67** that provides potable water service or sewer service for compensation and **that has adopted and is operating in accordance with by-laws** or articles of incorporation which ensure that it is member-owned and member-controlled. The term does not include a corporation that provides retail water or sewer service to a person who is not a member, except that the corporation may provide retail water or sewer service to a person who is not a member if the person only builds on or develops property to sell to another and the service is provided on an interim basis before the property is sold.<sup>4</sup>

Section 67.007 specifically requires a WSC to comply with certain requirements when holding its annual member meetings, including the elections of its board of directors - everything from how a notice or ballot is prepared and mailed to how the final vote count is tallied. These specifics are set forth in further detail in the written election procedures required of all WSCs:

- a) The annual meeting of the members or shareholders of the corporation must be held between January 1 and May 1 at a time specified by the bylaws or the board.

(a-1) A quorum for the transaction of business at a meeting of the members or shareholders is a majority of the members and shareholders present. In determining whether a quorum is present, all members and shareholders who mailed or delivered ballots to the independent election auditor or the corporation on a matter submitted to a vote at the meeting are counted as present.

(b) The board shall adopt written procedures for conducting an annual or special meeting of the members or shareholders in accordance with this section and Sections 67.0052, 67.0053, and 67.0054. The procedures shall include the following:

- (1) notification to eligible members or shareholders of the proposed agenda, location, and date of the meeting;
- (2) director election procedures, including candidate application procedures;
- (3) approval of the ballot form to be used; and
- (4) validation of eligible voters, ballots, and election results.

(c) The board shall adopt an official ballot form to be used in conducting the business of the corporation at any annual or special meeting. No other ballot form will be valid. Ballots from members or shareholders are confidential and are exempted from disclosure by the corporation until after the date of the relevant election.

(d) The board shall select an independent election auditor not later than the 30th day before the scheduled date of the annual meeting. The independent election auditor is not required to be an experienced election judge or auditor and may serve as an unpaid volunteer. At the time of selection and while serving in the capacity of an independent election auditor, the independent election auditor may not be associated with the corporation as:

- (1) an employee;
  - (2) a director or candidate for director; or
  - (3) an independent contractor engaged by the corporation as part of the corporation's regular course of business.
- (e) This section applies only to a corporation that provides retail

water or sewer service.<sup>5</sup>

Chapter 67 also incorporates the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act,<sup>6</sup> and additional statutory requirements for elections, including certain other details for ballots, officers, notices, annual meetings, and qualifications for directors.<sup>7</sup> If AWSSSC failed to comply with the TWC § 67.007 requirements on their face, its own adopted election procedures, or those requirements incorporated through the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act and Chapter 67 generally (as incorporated through TWC § 13.002(24)), then the Commission has the same jurisdiction over the corporation as it does over other problematic utilities.

AWSSSC bylaws include requirements such as preparing annual financial audit reports and federal tax returns,<sup>8</sup> conducting all meetings in accordance with TOMA, chapter 551 of the Texas Government Code,<sup>9</sup> adopting a conflict of interest policy,<sup>10</sup> and ensuring all financial transactions are conducted in a manner that protects the financial integrity of the corporation.<sup>11</sup> If AWSSSC fails to operate in compliance with any of these bylaw requirements, then the Commission has the same jurisdiction over AWSSSC as it does over any other problematic water and sewer utilities.

Importantly, TWC § 13.004(a) does *not* state that a WSC must fail to hold its annual meetings properly (TWC § 13.004(a)(1)) or operate in non-compliance with its bylaws and/or TOMA (TWC § 13.004(a)(2)) one, a dozen times or one hundred times to lose its WSC status. Moreover, it is not a defense under the statute for a WSC that is violating TWC § 13.004(a) to be small, rural, voluntary or well-meaning. Indeed, it is precisely these types of WSCs for which Commission supervision and/or receivership is most appropriate and makes the most fiscal and management sense. Nevertheless, as the

attached tables of deficiencies show, and as Complainant's expert and fact witnesses will demonstrate at hearing through evidence, there are numerous uncontroverted violations over a period of several years, including even its most recent elections, which confirm that AWSSSC has not acted like a member-owned, member controlled entity that can remain unchecked.

### **III. TABLE OF DEFICIENCIES**

In accordance with Order No. 6, Complainant's verified tables of alleged deficiencies are attached as Exhibit A and Exhibit B, which illustrate in detail AWSSSC's numerous violations over a long period of time. Exhibit A, verified by Complainant Carol Gillespie, sets out AWSSSC's failure to comply with annual meeting and election requirements, which are violations of TWC § 13.004(a)(1) as it relates to TWC § 67.007. Exhibit A also lists AWSSSC's failure to operate in a manner that complies with the requirements for a nonprofit WSC (i.e., failure to comply with nonprofit corporation bylaws), which is a violation of TWC § 13.004(a)(2) of a WSC as defined by TWC § 13.002(24).

Exhibit B, verified by Complainant's expert Judge Bill Aleshire, includes AWSSSC's violations of TOMA,<sup>12</sup> which compliance is required under AWSSSC's bylaws. Again, bylaw noncompliance is by definition failure to comply with the requirements for a WSC as set out in TWC § 13.004(a)(2) and TWC § 13.002(24). As an aside, Tex. Gov't Code Ann. § 551.001(k) defines a water supply or sewer service corporation organized under TWC Chapter 67 to be a governmental body, and Tex. Gov't Code Ann. § 551.002 requires every regular, special, or called meeting of a governmental body to be open to the public.

Reading both Exhibit A and B tables left to right, the first column breaks out in detail AWSSSC's deficiencies in failing to adhere to its election procedures, bylaws, and TOMA, including but not limited to its failure to provide proper notices of the annual and

special meetings, proper ballots, proper director's applications,<sup>13</sup> proper meeting packets, voting rosters, and election reports. AWSSSC has similarly failed to have a conflict of interest policy or appoint a credentials committee and independent auditors who comply with its election procedures while neglecting its financial management obligations in the meantime. In terms of TOMA compliance, AWSSSC has shown a pattern and practice of walking quorums, not posting meeting notices with specificity, discussing items not specifically noticed, improperly posting its closed meeting notices, improper consultation during those closed meetings, and illegal action thereafter. Certified agendas, recordings, and minutes are frequently deficient if not non-existent.

The second column of both the Exhibit A and B tables provides the specific corresponding citations to the statutory or bylaw provision(s) that AWSSSC has violated. The third column, legal cause of action, explains how the violation described in the first column and cited in the second column is either a violation of TWC §§ 67.007 or 13.002(24) which in turn all constitute violations under TWC § 13.004(a) evoking the Commission's jurisdiction over WSCs. The fourth column, repeated throughout the table, explains that the Commission has the same jurisdiction over water and sewer utilities as WSCs which violate TWC §13.004(a)(1) or (2). These columns' entries are repeated. Regardless of whether AWSSSC violates TWC § 67.007, its bylaws or TOMA, the remedy remains the same: PUC is authorized to treat AWSSSC like any water or sewer utility and would have wide discretion to do various things like dissolve the board, put the WSC under Commission supervision, impose receivership, approve or deny rate changes, etc. The fifth and final column provides the legal authority for the Commission to take original jurisdiction over a WSC and treat them as any water or sewer utility. Just as the remedy remains the same, the statutory and regulatory authority for the remedy - TWC §13.004(a) and 16 TAC §§ 24.35 and 24.141 - are likewise the same despite the various types of alleged deficiencies.

The Legislature exempted WSCs from many Commission regulations because the corporations are intended to be member-owned and member-controlled through an elected board of directors. The statutes require these nonprofit corporations to make their

decisions in the full light of day. AWSSSC's chronic failure to follow its bylaws, Chapter 67 annual meeting and election requirements, and TOMA, however, show a blatant disregard for the law and disdain for public oversight regarding its decision-making. AWSSSC's actions and incompetence regarding the law support the Commission's supervision, imposition of a receiver, or both. AWSSSC can no longer ignore the basic rules of public governance that apply to all other WSCs across Texas.

Finally, because there was no rule or policy guidance directing the style and content of Gillespie's original July 14, 2014 complaint and follow-up letters, Ms. Gillespie made her original filings pro se, without the aid of discovery responses, and under the informal direction of Commission staff. Accordingly, the allegations cited herein supersede and replace the allegations in Gillespie's 2014-2015 complaint letters and should be considered the basis for jurisdiction in this docket.

### **III. CONCLUSION**

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Complainant prays that the ALJs deny Avalon's Motion to Dismiss, Motion to Certify the Question, Motion to Continue the Abatement and Motion for Discovery Schedule Hearing, and issue an order resuming the hearing schedule proposed by Commission staff, and for all other relief to which Complainant may be entitled.
