Phase III - Martin Realty and Land, Inc. is currently negotiating to purchase an additional piece of property adjacent to the property being requested in this CCN amendment. If the proposed purchase is successful an additional 6" well, an additional 5,495 gallon hydropneumatic tank, a 65,776 gallon ground storage tank and two additional 15 Hp booster pumps will be constructed for water service capable of serving an additional 275 connections.




