**ORDER NO. 2
REQUIRING COMMENTS ON STATUS**

I. Application

On April 9, 2014, Founder's Reserve Community Association, Inc. filed with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) an application to obtain new water and new sewer Certificates of Convenience and Necessity in Montgomery County. The application was received by the Public Utility Commission of Texas on September 25, 2014. The PUC Agency Interchange has identified Item No. 6 as an amended application; however, it is stamped with the original TCEQ file date of April 9, 2014, and appears to be the same as the application identified in Item No. 1.

II. Restyling Application

TCEQ noted that this application is also intended to decertify a portion of CCN Nos. 13146 and 21025 held by the City of Shenandoah.¹ For this reason, the style of the case is revised to read: *Application of Founder's Reserve Community Association Inc. for Certificates of Convenience and Necessity and to Decertify a Portion of the City of Shenandoah's CCNs in Montgomery County (37884-C).*


