# ORDER NO. 3 FINDING APPLICATION INCOMPLETE AND DEFICIENT, ESTABLISHING DEADLINES AND OPPORTUNITY TO CURE

## I. Application

On July 9, 2014, the City of Pleasanton (Pleasanton) filed with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) an application to obtain water and sewer Certificates of Convenience and Necessity in Atascosa County. On September 1, 2014, the processing of Pleasanton's application was transferred to the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission)

# II. Staff Recommendation on Administrative Completeness of the Application

On October 24, 2014, Commission Staff filed comments on the application. Commission Staff has determined that the application is not administratively complete because it contains material deficiencies, as specifically described in Commission Staff's October 24, 2014 filing and the attached memorandum of George Gogonas, Utility Rates Analyst/Auditor, Water Utilities Division. Pursuant to P.U.C. SUBST. R. 24.8(a), applications are not considered filed until a determination of administrative completeness is made, thus at this time the application is not considered filed with the Commission.

# III. Proposed Procedural Schedule

Commission Staff proposes that Applicant be given thirty (30) days to address the deficiencies identified by Commission Staff. Commission Staff proposes to file additional comments regarding completeness of the amended application, along with a proposed procedural schedule once the application is administratively complete.

#### IV. Finding Application Incomplete and Deficient, Providing Opportunity to Cure

Consistent with Commission Staff's recommendation, Pleasanton's application is found administratively incomplete and deficient. On or before December 1, 2014, Pleasanton shall amend its application to cure the deficiencies noted by Staff. Processing of the application cannot proceed until the requested information is received.

Commission Staff shall file a supplemental recommendation regarding administrative completeness of the amended application and notice along with a proposed procedural schedule within ten working days of receipt of the amended application.
