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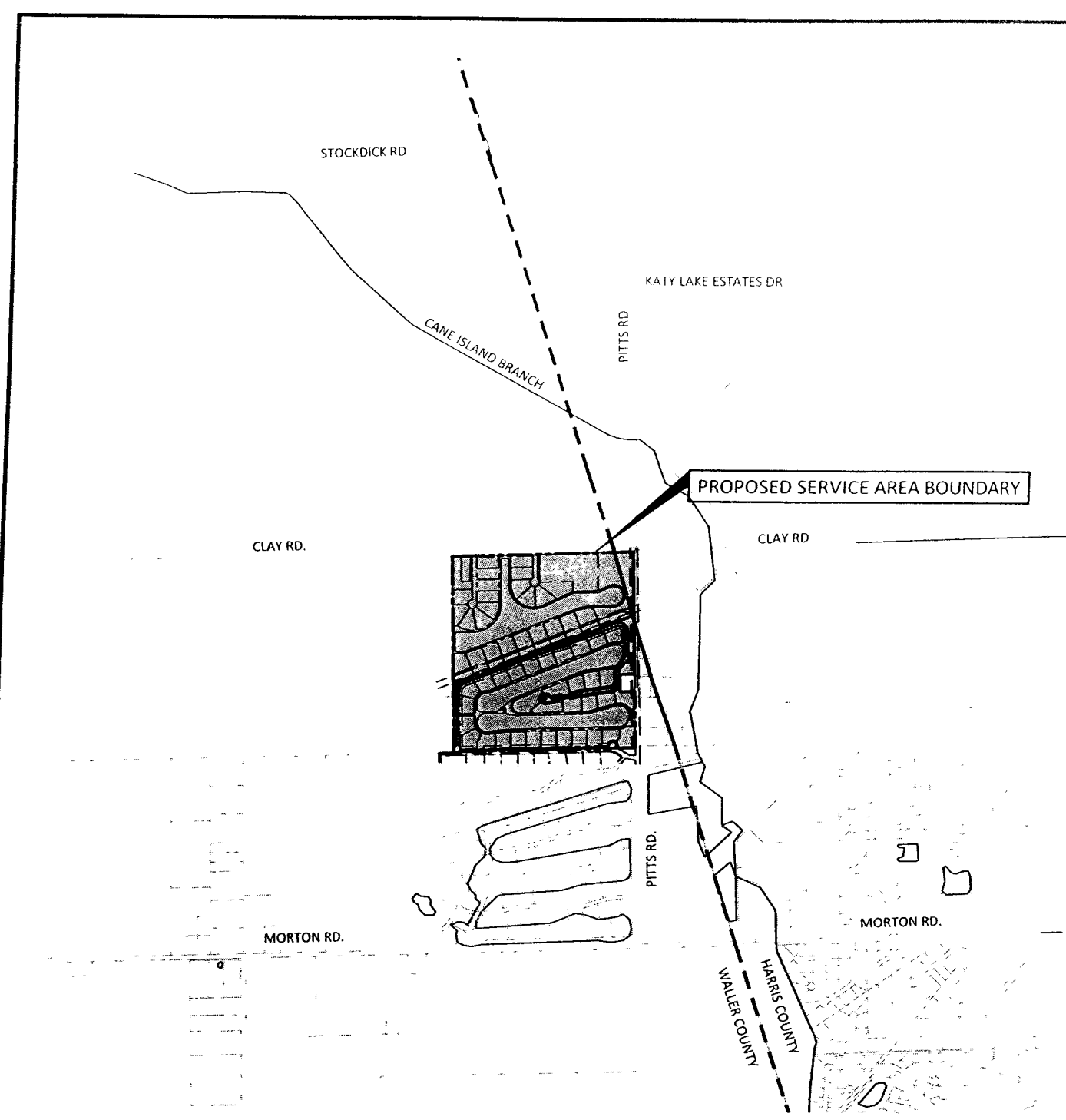
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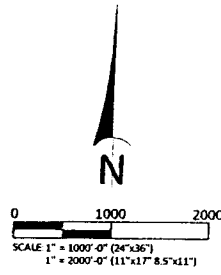

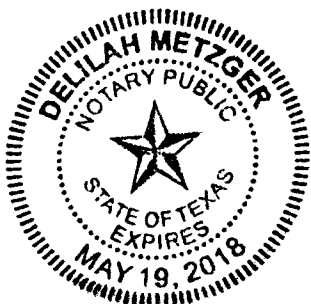

came those obstacles, responding with a 2-1 victory.

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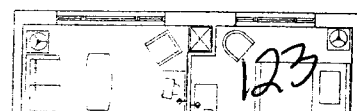

Woman shares her weight-loss program

to health and well-being. I don't get on a scale. I track measurements," Franklin said.

She's not afraid to put her money where her mouth is either. Franklin is the founder of #ShapeUp 60-day challenge, which is held several times a year. Participants pay a \$25 entry fee and have the chance to win a sizable cash prize.
