




The North Texas Municipal Water District (the "District") has considered the above referenced application of the Town of Little Elm (the "Town") for a Sewer Certificate of Convenience and Necessity ("CCN"). We understand that the CCN application is for a certificate to provide retail sewer (wastewater) service within the corporate boundaries and extra-territorial jurisdiction of the Town.

The District does not provide retail sewer service to individual customers. The District provides wholesale sewer treatment service to its member and customer cities. Therefore, the District does not object to and consents to the Town being granted a sewer CCN to provide retail sewer (wastewater) service to its existing and potential retail customers located within the corporate limits and extra territorial jurisdiction of the Town.

The City of Frisco (City) has considered the above referenced application by the Town of Little Elm (Town) for Water and Sewer Certificates of Convenience and Necessity (CCN). The City understands that the CCN application is to expand the Town's CCN boundaries to include uncertificated areas that are currently being provided water and sewer services by the Town, some of which lie within the City's corporate boundaries.

The proposed CCN boundary changes will have no effect on the City's current CCN boundary or retail customers served. The City does not object to the Town updating its water and sewer CCN boundaries in the above-reference application and to provide retail water and sewer service to its existing and potential customers located within the proposed service area as shown on the attached map that may also be located within the corporate boundary of the City of Frisco.
