The purpose of this letter is to formally withdraw, on behalf of myself and as the designated representative of Capital Pacific Holdings, LLC ("Capital"), as a party to the public hearing concerning the City of Austin's ("City") applications for certificates of convenience and necessity ("CCN"), Application Nos. 33562-C and 33563-C.

On October 24, 2001, I submitted a letter of protest to the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission requesting a public hearing regarding the above-referenced applications. On July 9, 2002, Capital became a party to the contested case hearing concerning the City's applications, with me acting as its designated representative.

Since that time, the City and I have resolved our differences regarding these applications.

Consequently, on behalf of Capital, I formally withdraw as a party to the above-referenced proceeding.
