# APPLICANT, CITY OF BANDERA'S STATUS REPORT AND MOTION TO EXTEND ABATEMENT

The APPLICANT, City of Bandera, hereby files this, its First Status Report and Motioner to Extend Abatement, and would show the Court the following:

- On September 2, 2009, a preliminary hearing was held in this case, and jurisdiction was proven. The City of Bandera (City), the Executive Director (ED), and the Office of Public Interest Counsel were each admitted as parties.
- 2 At the preliminary hearing, the ED moved to abate the case for 60 days to give the parties additional time to attempt to negotiate a settlement. All parties supported the motion. As a part of granting the motion, a status report is required to be filed by the parties by November 2, 2008.
- 3 (In November 3, 2009, the ED and Applicant moved to abate the case for 60 additional days to give the parties additional time to attempt to negotiate a settlement. All parties supported the motion. As a part of granting the motion, a status report is required to be filed by the parties by January 4, 2010.
- 3 The City has undertaken significant efforts to satisfy the concerns of the ED by clarifying the mapping issues brought by the ED.

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- The parties have been negotiating in good faith, and continue to negotiate in good faith
- 5. The City has spoken with a representative of the Executive Director for the TCEQ. All parties believe that further negotiation is in the best interest of all parties, and no party opposes an extension of the abatement.
- 6 The City hereby requests an extension of the abatement for an additional thirty days to continue and conclude negotiations and achieve a settlement of all issues with all parties.
- 7. This extension is not sought for the purpose of delay, but rather for the purpose of coming to an agreement with all adverse parties.

#### Prayer

8 For these reasons, the City asks that the Court accept its Status Report, and grant the requested extension of the abatement for thirty days to allow the parties to continue to negotiate and seek settlement of these issues.
