Re: Application of Town of Providence Village For Single Certification Under Texas Water Code Section 13.255 (the "Application"); PUC Dk. No. 43733

Dear P.U.C.:

Enclosed for filing in the above referenced docket is an original and six copies of supplemental items for the pending Section 13.255 Application filed by the Town of Providence Village (the "Town") and Providence Village WCID of Denton County (the "WCID") as Co-Applicants. These items are being filed pursuant to Order No. 6 in this docket in order to address deficiencies cited in Commission Staff's Response to Order No. 5. The items being filed herewith are as follows:

- 1. General Map (vicinity map). This map shows the general vicinity of the areas affected by the Application. In addition, this map shows the incorporated limits of the Town (outlined in red); the area which is currently included within the water and sewer CCNs of Mustang Special Utility District ("Mustang") (colored in light brown); and the area which is currently dually-certified to both Mustang and the WCID (shown as hatched diagonal blue lines).
- 2. <u>Map showing Proposed Decertification and Single Certification Area.</u> The area shown in blue on this map shows the incorporated limits of the Town which is the area which the Co-Applicants are seeking to have decertified from Mustang and singly-certified to the WCID as authorized by Sec. 13.255(b) (stating that the purpose of a Sec. 13.255 application is "to grant single certification to the municipally owned water or sewer utility or to a franchised utility") (emphasis added). Also note that as indicated on these revised maps, the Co-Applicants have deleted their request to have any ETJ areas of the Town included within the Application.
- 3. Water and Sewer Infrastructure Maps.

4. A CD diskette with digital mapping data. This diskette contains all data in a digital format to support the above maps as requested in the PUC staff memo of April 2, 2015. Only one copy of the diskette is being filed since we are contemporaneously uploading the digital data to the PUC through its web site.

The PUC staff memo of April 2, 2015 also notes that "it appears that the application has been revised to only show Providence Village WCID as a joint applicant and the Town of Providence Village is not included as an applicant in the amended application." This comment is mistaken since the Page 1 of 6 of the amended application filed with PUC on March 24, 2015 (showing Providence Village W.C.I.D. of Denton County as co-applicant) clearly shows that such page is "Supplemental Page 1 of 6" and thus is an addition to the original Page 1 of 6 showing the Town of Providence Village as applicant. Therefore both entities are clearly shown as co-applicants for this Application.

Please let me know if you need any other information in order to process this Application toward a declaration of Administrative Completeness.
