# ORDER NO. 8 RESTYLING APPLICATION, SECOND NOTICE FINDING APPLICATION INCOMPLETE AND DEFICIENT, ESTABLISHING DEADLINES AND OPPORTUNITY TO CURE

# I. Amended Application and Restyling Proceeding

On March 24, 2015, in response to Order No. 5, the Town of Providence Village and coapplicant, Providence Village WCID of Denton County (collectively, the Applicants), filed an amended application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission). This proceeding is restyled to reflect the joining of Providence Village WCID of Denton County as a co-applicant: Joint Application of The Town of Providence Village and Providence Village WCID of Denton County to Obtain Certificates of Convenience and Necessity and Request to Decertify a Portion of Mustang Special Utility District's Certificate of Convenience and Necessity in Denton County. On April 23, 2015, Applicants provided supplemental information in response to Order No. 6 in an attempt to cure deficiencies noted by Commission Staff.

### II. Staff Recommendation on Administrative Completeness of the Amended Application and Notice

On May 29, 2015, Commission Staff commented on the amended application. Commission Staff has determined that the application is still deficient and not administratively complete because it contains material deficiencies, as specifically described in Commission Staff's May 29, 2015 filing and the attached memorandum of Heidi Graham and Tracy Harbour of the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division. Pursuant to 16 Tex. Admin. Code

§ 24.8(a), applications are not considered filed until a determination of administrative completeness is made, thus at this time the application is not considered filed with the Commission.

#### III. Proposed Procedural Schedule

Commission Staff proposes that applicant be given 30 days supplement the application with the additional information to address the deficiencies identified by Commission Staff.

## IV. Finding Amended Application Incomplete and Deficient, Providing Opportunity to Cure

Consistent with Commission Staff's recommendation, the Town's application remains administratively incomplete and deficient. On or before **July 3, 2015**, Applicant shall amend its application to cure the deficiencies noted by Staff. Processing of the application cannot proceed until the requested items are received and reviewed.

On or before **August 3, 2015**, Commission Staff shall file a supplemental recommendation regarding administrative completeness of the amended application and notice along with a proposed procedural schedule..
