Denton County Fresh Water Supply District No. 10 has filed an application to amend CCN No. 13021 and CCN No. 20923 with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality to provide water and sanitary sewer utility service in Denton County.

The proposed amendment to the utility service area is located approximately 3 miles north of downtown Little Elm, Texas and west 3 miles from downtown Prosper, Texas, and is generally bounded on the north by south right of way line of Parvin Road; on the east by the west right of way line of County Line Road; on the south by the north right of way line of US 380 and on the West by the east right of way line of FM 1385. The total amendment service area being requested includes approximately 5,100 acres.

A request for a public hearing must be in writing. You must state (1) your name, mailing address, and daytime telephone number; (2) the applicant's name, application number or another recognizable reference to this application; (3) the statement, "I/we request a public hearing"; (4) a brief description of how you or the persons you represent, would be adversely affected by the granting of the application for a CCN; and (5) your proposed adjustment to the application or CCN which would satisfy your concerns and cause you to withdraw your request for a hearing.

Persons who wish to intervene or comment should write the:

within thirty (30) days from the date of this publication or notice. A public hearing will be held only if a legally sufficient hearing request is received or if the Commission on its own motion requests a hearing. Only those individuals who submit a written hearing request or a written request to be notified if a hearing is set will receive notice if a hearing is scheduled.

If a public hearing is requested, the Executive Director will not issue the CCN and will forward the application to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH) for a hearing. If no settlement is reached and an evidentiary hearing is held, the SOAH will submit a recommendation to the Commission for final decision. If an evidentiary hearing is held, it will be a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.
