Groveton's fourth TD came after the Tigers were forced to punt. The Indians took over on their 27-yard line and used five plays to get into the end zone -- including a 45-yard run by Washington to open the drive.

The TD came on a 16-yard up the gut push by Williams with 3:30 left in the half.

On the point-after, Groveton again went for two on a Williams keeper that gave the Indians a 30-0 lead going into half-time.

Following the mid-game break, which saw the crowning of a homecoming queen and king, the Tigers offense at first continue to spin its wheels in the mud, but the defense began to find traction.

On the Indian's first offense drive of the second half, they failed to score for the first time when a pitch from Williams to Washington went wrong and Trinity's sophomore defender Stephen Smith recovered the loose ball.

When the Tiger offense was subsequently forced to punt the ball away, the Indians got another chance and they took advantage of it.

Taking over at their 33-yard mark, Groveton used six plays to score, with the TD coming off a 36-yard run by Washington with 11:50 left in

the fourth quarter.

A point after kick by junior Jackson Pruitt was blocked by Trinity with Tiger freshman Jordan Ross picking up the loose ball and running it back to the 50-yard line before being brought down by the Indians.

The play left Groveton with a 36-0 lead with most of the fourth quarter left to play.

The Tiger offense took the Indian kickoff but was forced to punt.

When the Indians took over on their 28-yard line, the managed to move it all the way to the Tiger six-yard line before the Trinity defense shut them down.

After taking over on downs at the six, Trinity finally put points on the board when Simmons handed the ball to Byerly, who broke free for the 94-yard run with Indian defenders in hot pursuit.

Byerly also did the honors on the point-after try, taking the handoff and racing into the end zone on the two-point conversion.

With 4:39 left in the game, the Indians' lead had been reduced to 36-8.

After taking the Tiger kickoff at the Indian 14, Groveton managed to hold onto the ball and let the clock run out, picking up a pair for first downs on the way.
