ORDER NO. 6 DEEMING APPLICATION ADMINISTRATIVELY COMPLETE, ADDRESSING NOTICE; AND ESTABLISHING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

I. Application

On April 25, 2014, the City of Three Rivers (Three Rivers or Applicant) filed with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) an application to amend a certificate of convenience and necessity in Live Oak County. The application was received by the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) on September 18, 2014. In Order Nos. 3, 4, and 5 the Commission found the application administratively incomplete and deficient. On February 25, May 26, and June 30, 2015, Three Rivers filed supplemental information to address the discrepancies identified by Commission Staff.

II. Administrative Completeness

On July 21 and 23, 2015, Commission Staff filed additional comments on the sufficiency of the application as amended. Commission Staff finds that Applicant's application as amended is sufficient for further review. Consistent with Commission Staff's recommendation, Applicant's amended petition is deemed administratively complete.

III. Notice

Commission Staff has reviewed Three Rivers' proposed notice with regard to applicable statutes and rules, and recommends Three Rivers send the notice as described in Commission Staff's July 21, 2015 filing and the attached memorandum of Mary Lupo and Tracy Harbour of the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division, using the forms attached to the Commission Staff memorandum. On July 23, 2015, Commission Staff filed amended notice correcting the CCN No. in the proposed notice attached to Staff's July 21, 2015 recommendation.

Consistent with Staff's recommendation, Three Rivers shall provide notice as described in Staff's July 21 and 23, 2015 recommendations using the forms attached to this Order. Three Rivers shall file a copy of the actual notice sent and file affidavits evidencing proof of notice by the deadline set forth below.

IV. Procedural Schedule

The following procedural schedule as proposed by Commission Staff is adopted:

City of Three Rivers filed an application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas to Amend Certificate of Convenience and Necessity No. 12642 for the provision of water utility service in Live Oak County.

The proposed utility service area is located approximately **3.5** miles **southwest** of downtown **Three Rivers**, Texas, and is **generally** bounded on the north **by Choke Canyon Reservoir**; on the east by **FM 1545**; on the south by **Nueces River**; and on the west by **FM 1545**.

The total area being requested includes approximately 3396 acres and 37 current customers.

A request for a public hearing must be in writing. You must state (1) your name, mailing address, and daytime telephone number; (2) the applicant's name, application number or another recognizable reference to this application; (3) the statement, "I/we request a public hearing"; (4) a brief description of how you or the persons you represent, would be adversely affected by the granting of the application for a CCN; and (5) your proposed adjustment to the application or CCN which would satisfy your concerns and cause you to withdraw your request for a hearing.

Persons who wish to intervene or comment should write the:

within thirty (30) days from the date of this publication or notice. A public hearing will be held only if a legally sufficient hearing request is received or if the Commission on its own motion requests a hearing. If a public hearing is requested, the Commission will not issue the CCN and will forward the application to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH) for a hearing. If no settlement is reached and an evidentiary hearing is held, SOAH will submit a recommendation to the Commission for final decision. If an evidentiary hearing is held, it will be a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.

If you are a landowner with a tract of land at least 25 acres or more, that is partially or wholly located within the proposed area, you may request to be excluded from the proposed area (or "opt out") by providing written notice to the Commission within (30) days from the date that notice was provided by the applicant. All request to opt out of the requested service area must include a scaled, general location map and a metes and bounds description of the tract of land.
