## ORDER NO. 18 ABATING PROCEEDING FOR 90 DAYS AND ESTABLISHING DEADLINES

This Order addresses the City of DeKalb's January 20, 2017 letter update in this proceeding. Dekalb reported that on January 2, 2017, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) approved DeKalb's alternate capacity request; reducing the city's water capacity requirement from 599 gallons per minute (GPM) to 399 GPM. DeKalb acknowledged that its current 292 GPM is still not sufficient, and reported that it is still in discussions with the City of Texarkana for additional water supply, but is now also considering a new well or other water supplier.

Based on the preceding discussion, no new information regarding the status of this application appears to be imminent. Therefore, this proceeding is abated for 90 days. On or before April 24, 2017, DeKalb shall provide a status update regarding its efforts to satisfy the TCEQ's water capacity requirements for its water system. On or before May 8, 2017, Commission Staff shall comment on DeKalb's status update and propose additional deadlines or continued abatement, as appropriate.
