



ORDER NO. 3 DEEMING APPLICATION ADMINISTRATIVELY COMPLETE, ADDRESSING NOTICE; AND ESTABLISHING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

On April 17, 2015, Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) Staff filed comments on the sufficiency of the application and notice. Commission Staff determined that Aqua Water Supply Corporation's (Aqua WSC) application be deemed administratively complete. Consistent with Commission Staff's recommendation, Aqua WSC's application is deemed administratively complete.

Commission Staff also reviewed Aqua WSC's proposed notice, recommending the provision of notice proceed as detailed in the memorandum attached to Commission Staff's recommendation. Consistent with Commission Staff's recommendation, Aqua WSC shall provide notice as specified in Commission Staff's recommendation.

Commission Staff recommends the following procedural schedule for this docket.¹ Accordingly, the following procedural schedule is adopted:

Deadline for Aqua WSC to file proof of notice	May 18, 2015
Deadline for intervention and for intervenor comment or request for hearing on the merits	Within 30 days of mailing or publication of notice, whichever occurs later
Deadline for Commission Staff's final recommendation, request for hearing or recommendation for further procedural schedule	June 22, 2015

¹ Commission Staff's procedural schedule allows for opportunity to either file a recommendation following the customer comment period or propose an additional procedural schedule for continued processing.



Parties are reminded that an original and 10 copies of documents relating to this proceeding must be filed with the Commission filing clerk according to P.U.C. PROC. R. 22.71. A copy of each document filed with the Commission must also be served on all parties.

Parties are also reminded that direct communications with the administrative law judges and presiding officer (collectively, ALJs) are prohibited. Questions concerning this order or any other order must be submitted in writing, filed with the Commission, and served on all parties of record.
