ORDER NO. 1 REQUIRING COMMISSION STAFF COMMENTS/RECOMMENDATION

I. Application

On June 23, 2015, Terra Southwest Inc. (Terra Southwest) and the Town of Little Elm (Little Elm) filed an application for sale, transfer, or merger of facilities and certificate of convenience and necessity rights in Denton County. Specifically, Terra Southwest proposes to transfer a portion of its existing water utility certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) containing the Hilltown subdivision from Terra Southwest CCN No. 11608 to the Town of Little Elm CCN No. 11202.

II. Establishing Deadline for Commission Staff's Recommendation

Pursuant to 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 24.8(a) (TAC), Commission Staff shall file, on or before **July 23, 2015**, comments/recommendation regarding administrative completeness of this application, whether additional notice may be required to comply with the applicable procedural rules, and propose a schedule for processing.

The Commission will submit notice of this application for publication in the *Texas Register* on July 10, 2015.

III. Filings

Unless otherwise specified, an original and ten copies of documents relating to this proceeding must be filed with the Commission filing clerk according to 16 TAC § 22.71. A copy of each document filed with the Commission must also be served on all parties as provided in

PUC TAC 22.74. All filings can be accessed on the Interchange, http://interchange.puc.texas.gov.

All parties shall provide their current addresses, telephone and facsimile numbers, if available, to all other parties and the Commission by filing and serving all parties with such information. Each party shall provide the Commission and all parties with updated address, telephone, and facsimile information if such information changes. The telephone and facsimile numbers will be placed on the service list for this proceeding. Parties are responsible for updating their own service lists to reflect changed information and the addition of any other parties.

IV. **Ex Parte Communications**

Pursuant to 16 TAC § 22.3(b)(2) ex parte communications with the administrative law judges and presiding officer (collectively, ALJs) are prohibited. Parties shall communicate with the ALJs only through written documents filed with the Commission's Filing Clerk and served on all parties. Questions concerning this order or any other order must be submitted in writing, filed with the Commission, and served on all parties of record.
