COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON NOTICE

COMES NOW the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff), representing the public interest, and files this Commission Staff's Recommendation on Notice. In support thereof, Staff shows the following:

I. BACKGROUND

On July 16, 2015, Denton County Municipal Utility District No. 7 (Denton County MUD 7) filed an application to obtain new water and sewer certificates of convenience and necessity in Denton County, Texas pursuant to Tex. Water Code (TWC) Subchapter G and 16 Tex. Admin. Code (TAC) Subchapter G. Denton County MUD 7 is seeking dual certification with Mustang Special Utility District. In its application, Denton County MUD 7 included an Agreement for Dual Certification whereby Mustang Special Utility District consents to the dual certification.

Order No. 11, issued September 28, 2016 deemed Denton County MUD 7's notice deficient and required Denton County MUD 7 to provide proof of supplemental notice by October 17, 2016. On October 19, 2016, Denton County MUD 7 filed notice affidavits and information. Order No. 11 also required Staff to provide a recommendation on notice within 10 day of Denton County MUD 7's filing. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

II. RECOMMENDATION ON NOTICE

Staff has reviewed Denton County MUD 7's affidavits of notice and, as supported by the attached memorandum of Jolie Mathis and Tracy Montes of the Water Utilities Division, Staff recommends that the notice is sufficient.

Deadline for Denton County MUD 7 to file signed consent forms with the Commission	January 4, 2017
If no hearing is requested, deadline for Staff to file a final recommendation	January 11, 2017
If no hearing is requested, deadline for parties to file joint proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law	January 20, 2017

On July 16, 2016, Denton County Municipal Utility District No. 7 (Applicant) filed an application to obtain new water and sewer certificates of convenience and necessity (CCNs) in Denton County. This application is being reviewed under Tex. Water Code § 13.241 – § 13.2502 (TWC) and 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 24.101 - § 24.107 (TAC).

On October 18, 2016, Applicant filed a copy of the notice mailed on October 18, 2016, with an attached signed affidavit that notice was mailed. Applicant also provided a list of the five entities located within the 2-mile buffer of the proposed water and sewer service areas that it provided notice to, which correspond to the list that Staff recommended were required to receive individual mailed notice. Therefore, Staff recommends that Applicant's notice is sufficient.
