## ORDER NO. 2 FINDING APPLICATION INCOMPLETE AND DEFICIENT, ESTABLISHING DEADLINES AND OPPORTUNITY TO CURE

### I. Background

On July 22, 2015, Twin Lakes Water Supply (Applicant) filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) an application to obtain a new water certificate of convenience and necessity in Tarrant County. On July 24, 2015, Order No. 1 was issued, requiring Commission Staff to file comments on administrative completeness of the application and proposed notice.

# II. Staff Recommendation on Administrative Completeness of the Application

On August 20, 2015, Commission Staff responded to Order No. 1, recommending that the application is not administratively complete because it contains material deficiencies as specifically described in the pleading and the attached memorandum of Heidi Graham and Tracy Montes of the Commission's Water Utilities Division. In addition, Commission Staff recommended that the Applicant should be directed not to provide notice of the application until these discrepancies are corrected and the application is deemed administratively complete.

## III. Proposed Procedural Schedule

Commission Staff proposes that Applicant be given time to address the identified deficiencies. Commission Staff also proposes to file additional comments regarding administrative completeness of the amended application, and propose a procedural schedule, if appropriate.



## IV. Finding Application Incomplete and Deficient, Providing Opportunity to Cure

Consistent with Commission Staff's recommendation, the application is found administratively incomplete and deficient. Pursuant to 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 24.8(a), applications are not considered filed until a determination of administrative completeness is made, thus at this time the application is not considered filed with the Commission.

On or before **September 21, 2015**, Applicant shall file supplemental materials to cure the deficiencies identified by Commission Staff. Processing of the application cannot proceed until the requested items are received and reviewed. On or before **October 21, 2015**, Commission Staff shall file a supplemental recommendation on the revised application and propose a procedural schedule, if necessary.
