Dear Mr. Ince:

On August 13, 2015, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) received planning material with your letter dated August 2, 2015 for the proposed community water system. Additional materials were received on September 17 and 21, 2015. Based on our review, the project generally meets the minimum requirements of Title 30 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) Chapter 290 – Rules and Regulations for Public Water Systems and is **conditionally approved for construction** if the project plans and specifications meet the following requirements:

- 1. The proposed Settler Crossing Section 2 public water system, PWS ID № 0080060, shall not be interconnected with its adjacent existing Settler Crossing public water system, PWS ID № 0080058, which is under the same ownership, without the submission of additional engineering planning material to address capacity and interconnection requirements.
- 2. The proposed Settler Crossing Section 2 public water system, PWS ID № 0080060, shall only serve 49 connections as it was designed per 30 TAC §290.45(b)(1)(A). However, if the Settler Crossing Section 2 intends to serve 50 and/or more connections in the future, plans and specifications, which are sealed and signed by a Texas licensed professional engineer, must be submitted for addition of a ground storage tank in order to meet the total storage capacity requirements in 30 TAC §290.45(b)(1)(C).
- 3. All chemicals used in treatment of water supplied by public water systems must conform to American National Standards Institute/National Sanitation Foundation (ANSI/NSF) Standard 60 for Drinking Water Treatment Chemicals. Conformance with this standard must be obtained by certification of the product by an organization accredited by ANSI per 30 TAC §290.42(j).

4. It is noted that the owner of the proposed new community water system has submitted an application for the amendment of its existing Certificates of Convenience and Necessity (CCN). Please do not provide retail potable water supply to the future residents within the proposed project area until the Public Utility Commission of Texas approves the application for the proposed amendment of CCN.

An appointed engineer must notify the TCEQ's Region 12 Office in Houston at (713)767-3500 when construction will start.

Texas Water Code Section 36.0015 allows for the creation of groundwater conservation districts (GCDs) as the preferred method of groundwater management. GCDs manage groundwater in many counties and are authorized to regulate production and spacing of water wells. Public water systems drilling wells within an existing GCD are responsible for meeting the GCD's requirements. The authorization provided in this letter does not affect GCD authority to manage groundwater or issue permits.

The design engineer or water system representative is required to notify the Utilities Technical Review Team in writing by fax at (512) 239-6972 or by emailing jonathan.pi@tceq.texas.gov and cc: vera.poe@tceq.texas.gov at least 48 hours before the well casing pressure cementing begins. If pressure cementing is to begin on a Monday, then they must give notification on the preceding Thursday. If pressure cementing is to begin on Tuesday, then they must give notification on the preceding Friday.

The TCEQ does not approve this well for use as a public water supply at this time. We have enclosed a copy of the "Public Well Completion Data Checklist for Interim Approval." We provide this checklist to help you in obtaining interim approval to use this well before we can give final approval.

The submittal consisted of five sheets of engineering drawings, technical specifications and an engineering report. Your additional information noted that the septic tanks will be used for each resident home to discharge itse wastewaters. As a result, no sewer lines will be constructed under this project. The proposed project consists of:

- One (1) public water supply well drilled to 200 feet with 180 linear feet (lf) of 5-inch nominal diameter (n.d.) American Society of Testing Materials (ASTM) F480 schedule 40 polyvinyl chloride (PVC) casing and pressure-cemented 180 lf;
- 20 lf of 2 1/2-inch n.d. stainless steel screen, no blank liner and no gravel pack;
- The well is rated for 80 gallons per minute (gpm) yield with a 10horsepower submersible pump set at 160 feet deep. The design capacity of the pump is 80 gpm at 300 feet total dynamic head;
- One (1) 3,000 gallon welded steel American Society of Mechanical Engineers hydropneumatic tank;

- Sodium hypochlorite disinfection equipment consisting of (1) 0.532 gallons per hour peristaltic chemical feeder and one (1) 25 gallon plastic bulk tank;
- Approximately 2,033 lf of 3-inch ASTM D1784 (Schedule 40) standard dimension ratio (SDR) 16 class 260 PVC waterlines;
- Approximately 4,725 lf of 2-inch ASTM D1784 (Schedule 40) SDR 15 class 280 PVC waterlines;
- Intruder resistant fence;
- All weather access road; and
- Yard piping, valves, and appurtenances.

This approval is for the construction of the above listed items only. Any additional components contained in this design were not considered.

The water treatment will be provided by Setters Crossing 2 public water system.

This project is located on the north side of Farm to Market (F.M.) Road 2187, approximately 2.6 miles west of its intersection with F.M. Road 1094 and approximately 3.8 miles west of the City of Sealy, in Austin County, Texas.

Please keep in mind that within 60 days of project completion the engineer must attest in writing that the project was constructed as described in the approved plans, specifications and any change orders filed with the TCEQ as required in 30 TAC §290.39(h)(3).

Please refer to the Plan Review Team's Log № P-08132015-079 in all correspondence for this project. This will help complete our review and prevent it from being considered a new project.
