



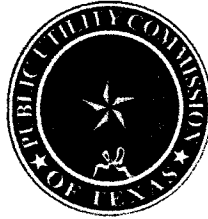

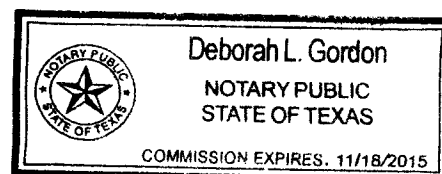

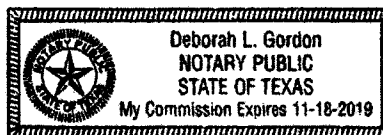

# Raiders beat Vidor, 28-13, Friday

## Victory clinches spot in playoffs for Raiders

The Lumberton Raiders clinched a spot in the playoffs on Friday with a 28-13 win over Vidor.

The Lumberton (7-2) have shown a huge improvement after winning three games last year and going winless the two years before.

In the first quarter, Caleb Thomas scored from four yards out. Ben Epkes kicked the PAT and Lumberton had a 7-0 lead.

The score by Thomas was set up by a series of penalties. Midway through the second quarter, Timothy Rhodes took control of the game.

After a Vidor punt to the Lumberton 32, Rhodes took the ball running to his right and then cut back to the middle of the field and broke into the clear on the way to a 68-yard dash to the end zone.

The kick by Benjamin Epkes was good making the score 14-0 in favor of the Raiders.

On Vidor's possession after the kick deep into its territory, Kain Dear broke up a Pirates' pass and the Raiders intercepted the ball at the Lumberton 37-yard line.

Rhodes then broke free on another TD run, this time on a 63-yard jaunt to help give the Raiders a 21-0 lead with 6:11 left in the half.

The run was spaced by a block from Caleb Thomas.

The self destructing Pirates fumbled the kick at their own 33-yard line and Caleb Thomas scored the next play on a 34-yard run.

In a matter of four offensive plays, the Raiders had scored three touchdowns and had a 28-0 lead.

The Raiders would need nearly everything that they had built.

The Pirates started their next possession at their own 41 and they went on a six-play drive for a touchdown.

They faced a tough situation at the Raider 26. Three straight carries had netted a total of nine yards and they went for it on fourth down.

Hayley Leckett picked up nine yards to gain a first down at the 16. Then Kolby

Humble scored the next play. Vidor had one more chance in the first half.

After stopping Lumberton at their 5-yard line, a 62-yard run by Humble ended when he was tackled at the Lumberton 27-yard line.

After halftime, Vidor drove downfield with Leckett making a big run of 38 yards that moved the ball to the 19-yard line. Four plays later, Vidor

scored a fourth-and-one at the 1-yard line. The Raider defense then made the big play of the game stacking up the Vidor runner and keeping them out of the end zone.

This play have been the big play of the entire game.

After the game coach Chris Babin stated that Vidor had their best play called on fourth down.

Lumberton went into a quarterback sneak defense. Vidor got confused with their blocking assignments and turned one of the Raiders defensive tackles loose.

Jacob Fussell went through the hole and wrapped up the ball carrier at the waist two yards from the goal line. He was able to keep the Pirates out of the end zone. Babin says it was a big play and a good deal.

Babin went on to say that Vidor picked up steam in the second half. He reasons that part of this was his defensive call. He felt that as long as they were three scores ahead they would take a cautious approach and this worked.

Lumberton did not muster much offense in the third period but they managed to keep Vidor out of the end zone.

Then on the first series of the fourth period, Vidor drove the ball 62 yards for a score.

They had to overcome two holding calls.

At one point, Lumberton appeared to have them stopped but a facemask penalty gave the Pirates a first down at the Lumberton 24. Blake Rowe put the ball in the end zone on a 28-yard run.

The kick failed with 4:57

left in the game. At this time the clock was becoming a factor.

An onside kick attempt was recovered by Lumberton and the Raiders were able to run the ball for five plays before giving it back to Vidor.

The Raiders won the game with their running attack. Each team rushed the ball 44 times. The Raiders picked up 426 yards and Vidor had 265.

Vidor completed one of six passes with one interception. Lumberton completed one of 11 passes for 25 yards. Vidor had three fumbles and lost two. Lumberton had one which they lost.

Penalties hurt the Raiders who were flagged 11 times for 110 yards.

Rhodes led the Raiders with 26 carries for 297 yards and two touchdowns. Thomas had 15 for 129 yards and two touchdowns.

Rhodes now has about 1,460 yards rushing this season. Thomas has about 690 yards rushing this season.

Vidor was led by Blake Rowe with 12 rushes for 141. Hayley Leckett had 13 rushes for 77 and Humble had 12 carries for 45.

The Raiders have now clinched a spot in the playoffs. Friday they travel to Nederland where they will take on the Bulldogs who are 6-8 this season and 6-1 in district play.

Nederland offers a big challenge for the Raiders. They are fresh off a disappointing loss to Goose Creek which was their first district loss of the year. They have big strong offensive linemen and big defensive linemen.

Couch Babin describes them as a good all around football team.

The Raiders cannot change their playoff position but could earn a share of the district championship if they can defeat Nederland and have help if PNG loses to Vidor.
