





INTRODUCTION

The Hood County Utilities, Inc. / Blue Water Shores Wastewater Treatment Facility was investigated on 11/10/2006 to determine compliance with applicable wastewater treatment regulations. This facility was recently purchased by Aqua Texas and is now operated by them. This investigation is a reconnaissance compliance investigation undertaken to assess the new owners / operators. An exit interview, explaining the results of the investigation, was conducted following the investigation with Aqua Texas employees Mr. Steve Blackhurst, P.E. - Regional Environmental Manager, Ms. Nola Famis Field Supervisor, and Mr. Jerry Valdez - Operator. A General Compliance letter was sent on 11/30/2006 to acknowledge compliance.

GENERAL FACILITY AND PROCESS INFORMATION

Hood County Utilities is permitted to operate a 0.088 MGD activated sludge package treatment plant whose source of wastewater is domestic sewage from a mostly mobile home community. Treatment units include:

- an equalization basin,
- bar screen.
- aeration basin.
- clarifier.
- chlorine contact basin, and
- sludge holding tank.

The primary and secondary flow measuring devices are a 60 degree V-notch weir and a Badger ultrasonic flow meter. There are a total of six lift stations with visual alarms in the collection system. Five of these lift stations feed the main lift station located on Blue Water Court.

The following modifications / improvements have been made to the facility since the new owners took possession on July 8, 2006.

- additional safety rails have been added.
- the clarifier chain was replaced,
- a sump pump has been added to the chlorine contact chamber to remove any solids that may accumulate.
- the chlorine tablet system has been removed and replaced with liquid chlorine and a new pump.
- a standby pump for the equalization basin has been added.
- · a potable water line and RPZ has been connected to the system, and
- lift stations have been cleaned and upgraded, including three replacement pumps.

The facility discharges via pipe to Lake Granbury in Segment No. 1205 of the Brazos River Basin. The discharge point into Lake Granbury is under water and approximately 50 feet from the lake shore; therefore, direct observation of the receiving water was not possible.

Effluent samples were not collected as part of the recon Samples will be collected in December 2006 as part of the Lake Granbury Sampling Project.

The effluent samples collected by the facility are typically analyzed by Talem Labs for BOD and TSS. Field measurements are typically analyzed by the plant operator. Sludge is hauled to the wastewater treatment plant at Willow Park. The annual sludge report was submitted as required.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

There are currently two Agreed Orders in effect for the facility. One was issued on January 11, 2005 for permit limit violations. The other Agreed Order was issued on January 18, 2006 for an unauthorized discharge that entered Lake Granbury.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The SV30 for the aeration basin was 575 ml. The sludge judge showed that the sludge blanket was 5 feet deep and 5feet from the surface. The BOD and TSS results for the months that Aqua Source has been in full control of the plant (August, September, and October) have all been well within permit limits.

INTRODUCTION

On February 3, 2016, the TCEQ DFW Region Office received a complaint alleging that Chisholm Springs WWTP was discharging wastewater with a noxious odor into a creek. A site investigation was conducted by Environmental Investigator Audrey Aringo on February 17, 2016 with no prior notification to the permittee. No violations are being cited as a result of this investigation. A copy of this report was sent to the complainants.

GENERAL FACILITY AND PROCESS INFORMATION

Aqua Texas owns, operates, and maintains the Chisholm Springs WWTP and collection system. The Chisholm Springs WWTP is permitted to discharge 0.45MGD.

BACKGROUND

The last comprehensive compliance investigation was conducted on May 21, 2015. Please refer to investigation report #1252428 for complete investigation findings.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

On February 17, 2016, the investigator met onsite with one of the complainants at 1140. According to the complainants, the WWTP was dumping effluent that had a noxious odor into the creek, and foaming was observed in the creek. The investigator observed the site at the creek where effluent is discharged from Chisholm Springs WWTP. No noxious odor was detected while observing the site at the receiving stream. At the time of the investigation, no unusual conditions were observed at the receiving stream.

The investigator drove around with the vehicle's windows down and surveyed the Chisholm Springs neighborhood and did not detect any noxious odors. As the allegations against the entity could not be substantiated during the investigation, no violations were cited. As required, a letter and a copy of the investigation report were sent to two of the complainants and the regulated entity. One of the complainants remained anonymous and so was not provided a report of the investigation findings.

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

INTRODUCTION

The TCEQ DFW Region office received a complaint on April 7, 2008 concerning a recurring discharge of wastewater from a manhole at the terminus of Outfitter's Court in Chisholm Springs The complainant said there was an odor problem and was also concerned about mosquitoes breeding in the area because the ground is constantly saturated. A second complaint was received on May 19. 2008 TCEQ Environmental Investigator Greg Diehl conducted an investigation on April 16, 2008. A follow-up investigation was conducted by TCEQ Environmental Investigators Suzanna Perea and Vik

Kafley on May 19, 2008. A notice of violation was issued to facilitate compliance. A copy of this report was provided to both of the complanants.

INVESTIGATION FINDINGS

Mr. Diehi conducted the initial investigation on April 16, 2008. At the time of the investigation, there was no discharge coming from the manhole, however, there was evidence that there had been an unauthorized discharge previously. Aqua Texas had reported an unauthorized discharge totaling 2000 gallons on March 27, 2008. There was no apparent odor, although the wind was very strong and any odor would have been difficult to detect.

The ground south and west of the Outfitter's Court cul-de-sac was very wet and appeared as if it were continuously wet for an extended period of time. There appeared to be at least three locations where water was seeping up from the ground and draining past the manhole in a generally westward direction. There is a well located at the end of outfitter's court, although it is not currently functional. The water did not appear to be seeping from the area of the well.

Water appeared to be seeping from the ground near a residence located on the south side of the cul-de-sac, apparently from two locations, one near the backyard and one near the front, in the vicinity of an electrical box. The water from both of these sources merged and flowed across a vacant lot and around the side of the cul-de-sac and then westward past the manhole and well. The third apparent source of seepage was from the ground to the north of the manhole TCEQ PWS Investigator Brandon Cooper conducted investigations of this area in February and April 2008 Mr. Cooper concluded that the source of this water was frequent backwashing of the potable water lines which is being conducted to address high levels of iron in the water supply

Following the investigation, Mr. Diehl spoke to Mr. Dickie Smethers, Field Supervisor for Aqua Texas Mr. Smethers indicated that the wastewater treatment plant at Chisholm Springs has been installed but has not been in operation because there is not enough flow being generated from the current residences. Chaney Environmental has been hired to pump and haul both of the lift stations as needed (at least once every other day). Waste is hauled to the treatment plant at Aqua Texas Shale Creek development.

A follow-up investigation was conducted by TCEQ Environmental Investigators Suzanna Perea and Vik Kafley on May 19, 2008. During this investigation, there was clear evidence of another unauthorized discharge of wastewater from the manhole. The area around the manhole was still wet and there were visible deposits of sludge on the ground. The area had recently been treated with HTH. The investigators were able to follow the flow of the discharge toward the west to the fence line where it appeared to flow onto the adjacent property toward a stock tank. Aqua Texas reported an unauthorized discharge totaling 250 gallons on May 19, 2008.

BACKGROUND/ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The permit for the wastewater treatment plant (WQ0014129-001) expired on December 1, 2006. Mr Diehl spoke to Mr Abel Bautista, Aqua Texas Wastewater Compliance Coordinator, on May 14, 2008 concerning the status of the permit. Mr. Bautista indicated that he is working on the permit application and hopes to submit it to TCEQ in the near future. Although there is a wastewater treatment plant constructed on site, it has not been on line because there is not enough flow to keep the plant functioning efficiently. Mr. Bautista estimates that they would need about 100 customers (homes) before they have sufficient flow to operate the plant.

A copy of TCEQ Regulatory Guidance Document RG-395 Unauthorized Discharges and Sanitary Sewer Overflows was provided to Aqua Texas along with a summary of this report.

Failure to prevent the unauthorized discharge (UD) of wastewater from the collection system. On two occasions (April 16, 2008 and May 19, 2008) the TCEQ DFW region documented evidence of sanitary sewer overflows from the manhole located at the end of Outfitter's Court.

During the May 19, 2008 investigation, there was evidence that the UD had not been properly mitigated. Although the area had been disinfected, sludge deposits were visible throughout the discharge route. There was no effort to contain the discharge or return it to the collection system. It appeared that the discharge had flowed off site and beyond the fence line toward a stock tank.

It was also noted during the investigation, that the lift station was not covered. The lift station should be covered at all times to prevent inflow into the collection system during rain events; to prevent unauthorized discharges; and, to help control odors.

Recommended Corrective Action: Submit to this office steps that will be taken to prevent sanitary sewer overflows from recurring in the future and steps that will be taken to respond to any future UDs in accordance with the TCEQ Regulatory Guidance. Unauthorized Discharges and Sanitary Sewer Overflows

What does this document cover?

The Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission (TNRCC) is responsible for protecting the state's waters. Part of that responsibility involves monitoring unauthorized discharges of wastewater (also known as sewage) and, when necessary, pursuing enforcement action. The purpose of this regulatory guidance document is to clarify the requirements for reporting unauthorized discharges and overflows from sanitary sewers.

Who should read this document?

The main audience consists of managers, professionals, and operating personnel from two kinds of organizations: (1) regulated entities and (2) subscribers.

A regulated entity (RE) is the holder of a water quality permit issued by the TNRCC and/or the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The RE may be a municipality, municipal water district, private individual, or company. (The TNRCC issues several types of water quality permits to REs; the most relevant permits to this document are those that regulate collection and treatment of wastewater.)

A subscriber is defined as any business or organization acting as a customer of an RE or as a waste contributor. Subscribers can range from a single large retail store that operates its own sewage lift station, to cities that collect waste and send it for treatment to a permitted wastewater treatment plant. Subscribers maintain a wastewater collection system that transports their wastewater to the collection

system of the permitted facility or directly to a permitted wastewater treatment plant.

What is an unauthorized discharge or sanitary sewer overflow?

An unauthorized discharge (UD) is any discharge of wastewater into or adjacent to the state's waters at a location not permitted as an outfall (see Clean Water Act Section 301 (a) or Texas Water Code Section 26.121; for ways to find state laws and regulations, see the heading "Where can I get more information" at the end of this document). An unauthorized discharge may include a discharge of wastewater onto the ground (paved or otherwise), or a discharge into a pond, creek, canal, river, lake, wetland, or any other body of surface water or groundwater.

A sanitary sewer overflow (SSO) is a type of unauthorized discharge of untreated or partially treated wastewater from a collection system or its components (that is, manhole, lift station, or cleanout) before reaching a treatment facility.

Caution: Do not use or interpret this guidance document as a substitute for the complete, official version of any state or federal law, rule, or regulation.

Do I need to report a UD or SSO?

Yes. The requirements for notifying the TNRCC about unauthorized discharges of wastewater are specified in an RE's water quality permit. A subscriber is responsible for reporting unauthorized discharges from its collection system in accordance with Texas Water Code Section 26.039.

Is there a minimum volume that I need to report?

No. There is no minimum reporting volume specified in federal or state regulations.

When do I have to report? And who do I report to?

Unauthorized discharges from the treatment plant and/or collection system must be reported to your TNRCC regional office as soon as possible but no later than 24 hours after you become aware of the violation.

[To locate your region's TNRCC office, go to the TNRCC's Web site (www.tnrcc.state.tx.us), click on the button "Contact and Locate Us" and then look at the listings under "Regional Offices." The same listings are available in printed form in TNRCC Publication GI-002. For ways to order publications and other information from the TNRCC, see the box on page 3.]

During normal business hours of 8 A.M. to 5 P.M., the 24-hour notice must be made orally or by facsimile transmission (fax) to your local regional office. If the UD or SSO occurs after normal business hours, telephone your regional office and follow the instructions in the recorded message. If the estimated volume is enough to trigger the public notification requirements of Chapter 30, Texas Administrative Code (TAC), Sections 319.301–.303, then the "responsible person" (as defined in 30 TAC Chapter 319) should notify the TNRCC Emergency Response Hotline (1-800-832-8224).

Do I have to make a written report? And what should it include?

For Subscribers. You must make an initial oral report. In addition, TNRCC requests that you follow up with a written report within five working days

after you become aware of the violation. (See the list below for points the report should cover).

For Regulated Entities In addition to the initial oral report, all water quality permit holders must submit a written report to the TNRCC regional office and to the TNRCC's Enforcement Division in Austin. The written report must be submitted within five working days after you become aware of the violation.

The Written Report. Include a description of.

- the nature of the UD or SSO (source, location, route, volume) and its specific cause:
- the potential danger to human health or safety, or the environment (including monitoring data, if collected);
- the duration of the UD or SSO with exact dates and times;
- an estimate of how long the noncompliance is expected to continue (if the noncompliance has not been corrected at the time of reporting);
- · actions taken to mitigate adverse effects; and
- steps taken to reduce, eliminate, and prevent recurrence of the noncompliance.

Is there a form I can use to report a UD or SSO?

Yes. TNRCC has a standardized form (TNRCC Form 0501), Water Quality Noncompliance Notification. This form can be used for the 24-hour fax notice and/or five-day written report. For ways to obtain TNRCC forms, see the heading "Where can I get more information," or you may obtain a copy from your local regional office.

Alternatively, you may provide written information in letter format. All noncompliance notifications must include the permit number of your wastewater treatment facility. All noncompliance notifications from subscribers must include the permit number of the treatment plant to which the collection system is connected.

You must keep a copy of any written report of UDs or SSOs at the facility site, or the reports must be readily available for review by TNRCC representatives, for a period of three years.

After I've met the initial notification requirements, then what do I do?

Each UD or SSO incident is unique, and cleanup requirements should be based on individual circumstances. In preparation, each business or organization capable of experiencing a UD or SSO should have a spill/overflow contingency plan to follow in the event of an incident. You should consider the following items when formulating your plan:

- · stop or mitigate the flow;
- contain the spill whenever possible;
- return as much of the spilled wastewater to the collection system or treatment facility as possible;
- remove and properly dispose of all solids;
- treat/disinfect the affected area as necessary (if using chemicals, be sure to follow the manufacturer's guidelines);
- act quickly to reduce any threat to human health and the environment; and
- assess impact to the environment by taking laboratory samples.

After a UD or SSO event has occurred, you should evaluate the causes of the incident and identify possible methods to prevent a recurrence. Don't forget to send in your written report within five working days.

What are the main causes of UDs and SSOs?

During dry weather, the most frequent causes of UDs and SSOs are reduced capacity, blockages, malfunctioning lift stations, and vandalism. Grease entering the collection system is a common contributor to dry-weather UDs and SSOs. It is possible to minimize dry-weather UDs and SSOs by implementing a good preventive maintenance program coupled with public education. Local enforcement of grease trap ordinances and pretreatment ordinances is also effective in reducing UDs and SSOs.

(For more information about grease traps, see Answers to Common Questions about Waste from Grease Traps, Grit Traps, and Septic Tanks, TNRCC Publication RG-389.

During wet weather, the most frequent causes of UDs and SSOs are infiltration and inflow (I/I) into the collection system. Infiltration is groundwater that enters the collection system through leaky pipes, faulty pipe joints, or defective manholes. Inflow is surface runoff that enters the collection system through missing or defective manhole covers, uncovered or damaged cleanouts, illegal storm water connections, or defective pipes and manholes located in streambeds or roadside bar ditches.

I/I can be confirmed by physical inspection of collection lines and manholes, smoke testing, and televising collection lines. Once problem areas are identified, a plan can be formulated to reduce I/I using a systematic approach of repair and replacement.

Aqua Utilities, Inc., 1421 Wells Branch Parkway, Suite 105, Pflugerville, Texas, has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) to renew Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (TPDES) Permit No. WQ0012563001 (EPA LD. No. TX0090697) to authorize the discharge of treated wastewater at a volume not to exceed a daily average flow of 20,000 gallons per day. ADDITIONAL NOTICE. After technical review of the application is complete, the executive director may prepare a draft permit and will issue a preliminary decision on the application. Notice of the Application and Preliminary Decision will be published and mailed to those who are on the county-wide mailing list or the mailing list for this application. That notice will contain the final deadline for submitting public comments.

OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING. After the deadline for public comments, the executive director will consider the comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. The response to comments, along with the executive director's decision on the application, will be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments or who requested to be on the mailing list for this application. If comments are received, the mailing will also provide instructions for requesting reconsideration of the executive director's decision and for requesting a contested case hearing. A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in a state district court.

A contested case hearing will only be granted based on disputed issues of fact that are relevant and material to the Commission's decision on the application. Further, the Commission will only grant a hearing on issues that were raised during the public comment period and not withdrawn. The TCEQ may act on an application to renew a permit for discharge of wastewater without providing an opportunity for a contested case hearing if certain criteria are met.


