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My name is Paul Klaus and I swear that the following testimony is within my personal knowledge and is factually true.

I obtained a C Ground Water license in 1997. I held a D Ground water license from 1984 through 1997. I held a Waste Water license from 2003 through 2007. I have owned and operated K & K Water, which services 75 customers since 1984. My work experience includes 12 years with the City of Austin and 9 ½ years with Bastrop County Water Control and Improvement District #2. I purchased Bastrop West Water system, which services 110 customers, in January 2012.

### Water Service for 168 Edmondson Lane

According to Texas Water Commission records (Exhibit 1), Bastrop West Water (BWW) system began operating on March 1, 1986. At that time, BWW system was owned and operated by Clyde E. Clardy. Beginning in November 1986 and continuing through April 1987, BWW and Aqua Water Supply appeared before the Texas Water Commission to determine which water system should provide service to the Bastrop County West and Bastrop County West Oaks 1 subdivisions. The Executive Director recommended that BWW should be issued a Certificate of

2 Convenience and Necessity (CNN) to serve the Bastrop County West Oaks subdivision, the

Edmondson Lane area in a 40 acre tract adjacent to Bastrop County West subdivision (with four

connections), and for the 14 customers currently being served by BWW in the Bastrop County

West subdivision. CNN 12050 was issued to BWW in October 1987 (Exhibit 2).

When I purchased the BWW system from Clyde E. Clardy in January 2012, BWW was supplying water service to 168 Edmondson Lane. At that time, 168 Edmondson Lane was owned and occupied by Jade Hinken. In approximately April 2014, Ms. Hinken contacted me because she intended to sell part of her property and needed to know what would be required to obtain water service for that portion. I told her she would need to have a second water meter set and the tap fee is \$450 (Exhibit 3).

After Ms. Hinken filed an application to subdivide her property, the issue of which water system had the CNN to service 168 Edmondson Lane came up. Throughout May 2014, BWW provided the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) with maps and other historical documentation to prove BWW held a CNN for 168 Edmondson Lane, one of the four original service meters on Edmondson Lane (Exhibit 4). Even Ms. Hinken asked the TCEQ to conclude BWW's CNN covered 168 Edmondson Lane in her May 27, 2014, email. Ms. Hinken specifically referenced the 1986 service agreement and an easement agreement between the previous owners of 168 Edmondson Lane and BWW as proof that the property was part of the

20 1987 CNN (Exhibit 5).

TCEQ was unable to locate the official maps that were referenced in the CNN. So, instead of basing its decisions on information that had been relied upon since at least 1986, TCEQ staff informally concluded that BWW would need to submit a CNN Amendment Application in order to provide service to 168 Edmondson Lane (Exhibit 4 June 16, 2014 email).

### 168 Edmondson Lane Account Transfer

Sometime between April and July 2014, I received a verbal request from Ms. Hinken to change the name on the 168 Edmondson Lane account from her name to Jeff Hill's name (Exhibit 6). No other issues were raised regarding the water service at 168 Edmondson Lane until December 2014 when Ms. Hinken complained because Mr. Hill was receiving water service through the only meter located on 168 Edmondson Lane.

I was not a party to the land sale. In December 2014, I did not know when or if the sale between Ms. Hinken and Mr. Hill had finalized, what the terms and conditions of the sale were, or whether the request to subdivide the property was ever approved. What I did know at that time is that months earlier the water service account had been transferred into Mr. Hill's name at Ms. Hinken's request due to the pending land sale and Mr. Hill was the only individual living at 168 Edmondson Lane (See Hinken's direct testimony @ Page 1 paragraph 1 lines 4 -5; page 5 paragraph 1 lines 6 -7; and page 7 paragraph 1 lines 6 -7). Therefore, I did not change the water service.

## **Damage Charges to Jade Hinken**

2	Per PUC rules, I am entitled to charge a property owner all labor, material, equipment
3	and all actual costs necessary to repair or replace damage caused by negligence. Negligence i
4	very different from meter tampering or bypassing and service diversion, which have never been
5	alleged by BWW.

I charged Ms. Hinken for damage caused by a person she hired to perform work at 168 Edmondson Lane. I do not know what Ms. Hinken's intentions were when she hired someone to work on her water service line. I do not know what instructions Ms. Hinken gave to the person she hired to perform work for her. And while Ms. Hinken may have the hired person to only work on the owner's side of the water meter, he caused damage to BWW's main water line, which I was required to repair.

Ms. Hinken's January 17, 2015, email confirms she was having work done on her side of the property (Exhibits 6, 7 and 10) and Hinken's direct testimony Page 3 – 5). Ms. Hinken provided notes on the work to be performed and photographs of the area where her handyman worked in her List of Issues (Exhibit 7). In emails dated February 16, 2015, and March 13, 2015, Ms. Hinken specifically identified the individual she hired as Vaughn Stevenson, DBA Hammer & Nail Works, 16102 Stewart Road, Austin, TX 78734 (Exhibit 8). This individual was working at 168 Edmondson Lane at Ms. Hinken's request.

Ms. Hinken filed a complaint against Vaughn Stevenson with the Better Business Bureau

(Exhibit 9). In that complaint, Ms. Hinken clearly states Mr. Stevenson cut and/or broke the

main water line on January 29, 2015. She does not deny Mr. Vaughn was working on her behalf or question the legitimacy of BWW's invoice or damages in her complaint against Mr. Stevenson. Both Ms. Hinken's and Mr. Stevenson's details regarding the break to the water line show that negligence was a definite factor in the water line break and ensuing damages.

On January 29, 2015, my wife received a call around 1:30 p.m. from Mr. Stevenson who said he was hired by Ms. Hinken and had broken the water line. He asked how to shut off the water at the meter. However, he did not explain how serious the water line break was. When I arrived around 4:30 p.m., I realized this was an emergency situation that would require extensive work because water was flooding the whole property. Mr. Stevenson had broken the water company's cut-off valve. This is a t-connection with valves on the water system's side and the property owner's side. When Mr. Stevenson tried to turn the curb stop on BWW's cut-off valve, he broke the cut-off valve, which caused a ¾ hole in the 1 ½ inch main water line.

I called for an emergency one-call line location because I needed to know the location of any phone, cable, or electrical lines. I could not begin any work to repair the broken water line until I knew where it was safe to dig. I also had to go home to get a valve key in order to shut off the main valve in the West Oaks subdivision. Going home required me to travel approximately 20 miles each way from 168 Edmondson Lane to 231 Mandy Lane in Red Rock. Due to the seriousness of the damage, I had to load a tractor onto a trailer and locate the supplies I needed to repair the damaged water line.

By the time I was able to shut off the water, it had been running uncontrolled for about 7 hours. In order to repair the damage to the water line, I had to dig a hole approximately 2

foot wide, 2 foot long, and 2 foot deep. It took me approximately an hour to finish the hole.

Once I uncovered the water line, I had to go to the main water line and install a T and put a new

curb stop on the owner's side. I used a saw to remove the damaged areas of pipe and glue and

clamps to install the new fixtures. After the water main was repaired, I had to flush the water

lines to prevent excess dirty water from the break. Before I could consider the job complete, I

had add a layer of sand under the new water meter box to cover up the repair and fill hole. I did

not cover the open area on Ms. Hinken's side of the water meter because I did not know what

her plans were.

I have years of experience with installing, maintaining, and repairing water lines and meters. It is much more cost-effective for me to install, maintain, and make repairs myself instead of hiring a contractor. I buy the parts I use to install, maintain, and repair water lines and meters in bulk and keep them in stock. I have included a list of the parts I used to repair the damage caused by Ms. Hinken's hired person (Exhibit 10). This list shows their individual prices at Home Depot. If I had gone to a store to buy parts on January 29, 2015, I would have needed to charge Ms. Hinken \$99.56 plus tax for parts. Instead, I charged for Ms. Hinken \$50 for parts (Exhibit 14).

Unlike a private contractor, I did not invoice Ms. Hinken separately for labor and equipment. I billed her \$275 in labor for the 7+ hours that I spent from the time I arrived to assess the damage Ms. Hinken's hired person had done until I completed the repair. That's approximately \$39.29 an hour. A private contractor would have charged \$180 an hour for a

back hoe and operator (see Exhibit 10). In an after-hours situation, a private contractor would
 charge even more to perform a repair.

In the water business, when a water leak or break occurs, a mathematical water loss calculation is used to determine the amount of water loss. This calculation is based off the type and size of the break or hole. I have attached a worksheet from that program showing the total water loss in gallons (Exhibit 11). I did not add any additional gallons for flushing the water line. As this worksheet shows, I accurately billed \$105 for water loss/usage.

### Water Meter Installation

Before I had to repair the damage caused by Ms. Hinken's repair person, I had explained to Ms. Hinken that any issues regarding Mr. Hill's right to receive water service through the existing meter was an issue that had to be resolved between the two of them. But I also explained a simple solution – install a second meter at a cost of \$450 (See tariff).

On January 30, 2015, Ms. Hinken sent a letter to Jeff Hill stating she would pay one half of the \$450 tap fee to resolve the water easement issue (Exhibit 12). Mr. Hill contacted me that day to confirm that he and Ms. Hinken has reached an agreement to split the cost to install a second meter. By the end of that day, I had told both Ms. Hinken and Mr. Hill that the tap fee was \$450. I also told both of them I would install the new meter as soon as possible after they let me know it was okay to proceed. Ms. Hinken forwarded their January 30, 2015, email exchange to me at 10:00 a.m. the next day so I would know to begin to install the new meter.

In the original emails, Ms. Hinken did not mention she would only agree to pay Mr. Hill one-half of the tap fee. At 3:29 p.m. on Sunday, February 1, 2015, Ms. Hinken forwarded another email to me reaffirming she would pay \$225 toward the water service. Ms. Hinken also confirmed that Mr. Hill could continue to use the water service until completion of the water service transfer.

Based on the information I received from Ms. Hinken and Mr. Hill, I installed a second water meter during the day on Monday, February 2, 2015. This water meter was located on what was represented to be the portion of 168 Edmondson Lane that Mr. Hill had purchased. At 9:40 p.m. on Monday, February 2, 2015, Ms. Hinken retracted her offer to pay for one-half of the tap fee (Exhibit 13).

## Termination of Water Service

On or about February 3, 2015, I sent Ms. Hinken an invoice for \$655, which represented \$430 for cost of the water damage repair and \$225 for the one-half she agreed to pay toward the tap fee (Exhibit 14). Although Ms. Hinken did not pay the February 3, 2105, invoice within 15 days, that was not the sole reason I terminated her water service.

Ms. Hinken had not been living at 168 Edmondson Lane for a very long time (Hinken direct testimony Page 1 paragraph 1 lines 4 -5; page 5 paragraph 1 lines 6 -7; and page 7 paragraph 1 lines 6 -7). When I realized she was so upset over the charges for the damage to the water line and the water meter installation, I immediately acted when she told me in the February 2, 2015, email that she did not need water service at that time (See Exhibit 9). She

stressed again in her March 13, 2015, email/letter that she "did NOT want or need water service for the month of February 2015." (See Exhibit 8). So, I did not charge her for service in February 2015. Ms. Hinken also told me in that same communication to "[a]ssume that you should shut it off [after the month of March], unless you hear directly from me before the first of April." Since the water was already shut-off and Ms. Hinken was not on-site, no charges were assessed for March 2015.

### Sale of Remainder of 168 Edmondson Lane

I was contacted by Kelley Harris, a real estate agent, regarding water service for the remaining portion of 168 Edmondson Lane because Ms. Hinken was selling the property. The buyers became aware Ms. Hinken owed BWW money and wanted the issue resolved before the closing. As Ms. Harris' May 9, 2015, email confirms (Provided by Ms. Hinken as an attachment to her List of Issues), BWW told the real estate agent that Ms. Hinken owed BWW money. Consequently, the real estate agent asked Ms. Hinken if she would pay the outstanding amount she owed to BWW before closing on the sale of. On August 11, 2015, my wife confirmed that to begin service for the buyers, Ms. Hinken needed to pay the outstanding \$655 invoice and a \$50 reconnection fee.

Ms. Hinken's August 12, 2015, letter, included as an attachment to her List of Issues; her complaint against real estate agent Kelley Harris (Exhibit 15); and her complaint against Austin Title Company (Exhibit 16) describe exactly what happened — to finalize the sale of the remaining portion of 168 Edmondson Lane, Ms. Hinken agreed to pay \$655 at closing to BWW,

which is the amount of the February 3, 2015. At no time did BWW send an invoice to the future
 owners of 168 Edmondson Lane (Exhibit 17).

In an Escrow Agreement, Ms. Hinken and the buyers included terms regarding the restoration of water service. However, BWW is not a party to the Escrow Agreement between Ms. Hinken and the buyers of 168 Edmondson Lane. BWW does not have any control over the parties' agreement or failure to agree on the final amount to be paid to BWW. On its own, the real estate company paid BWW. However, BWW is not a party to any dispute regarding the ownership of the money held in escrow. BWW has no authority to instruct the title company or the escrow officer to release those funds to anyone.

10 <u>Conclusion</u>

Issues regarding the CNN should be handled pursuant to PUC Chapter 24, Subchapter G — and separately and distinctly from a consumer complaint. A TCEQ staff person should not be able to decide in 2014 based on maps generated by new technology that a property, which had been served by BWW since 1986, is no longer in BWW's CNN. The parties are owed substantive and procedural rights before it can be determined that years of good faith reliance on the historical findings of the Texas Water Commission are invalid. It is a further disservice to the customers of BWW that the State cannot locate the maps it relied upon when making its findings in 1986.

PUC rules do not require me to provide the amount of detail in the damage invoice that

Ms. Hinken now suggests is required. I complied with all legal requirements regarding the

charges to Ms. Hinken for damages caused by her contractor's negligence. She was happy with
the invoice detail when she filed a complaint with the Better Business Bureau against her
contractor. Ms. Hinken was also satisfied with the amount of detail I provided when she signed
a contract to sell the remaining portion of 168 Edmondson Lane and agreed to place \$655 in

I tried to help Ms. Hinken get herself out of a dispute with Mr. Hill, who bought property from her, because he clearly believed he purchased the water meter with the property. Ms. Hinken told me repeatedly that she would pay one-half of the water tap installation fee. At no time, did she request written documentation of any type concerning installation of water meter or sharing the tap fee cost.

Based on my experiences with Ms. Hinken, I responded right away when Ms. Hinken told me she did not want water service at 168 Edmondson Lane. I tried to avoid upsetting her any further by waiving water service fees, even though she did not request disconnection sufficiently in advance.

I cannot help Ms. Hinken with her dispute over escrow money with the buyers of 168 Edmondson Lane. I have no legal rights and no ability to instruct anyone on how the money in escrow should be handled.

These examples of Mr. Clardy's failure to accept agency interpretation of agency regulations belie the assertion that Bastrop West Water System will continue to provide adequate service and will be an improvement over Aqua's system.

VII.

Position of the Executive Director

Aqua agrees with the recommendations of the Executive Director and would encourage the Examiner to adopt those recommendations. Aqua should only be certified in Bastrop County West Oaks, the Edmundson Lane area, in a 40 acre tract adjacent to the Bastrop County West subdivision, and for those 14 customers which are presently connected to the Bastrop West Water System in the Bastrop County West subdivision. Aqua also agrees with the recommendation of the Executive Director that Bastrop West Water System be ordered to charge all customers equal rates, as required by Section 13.190 of the Texas Water Code, and that Bastrop West Water System be ordered to maintain separate books and records for the water system which are in conformance with the requirements of 31 TAC \$291.72.

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Aqua Water Supply Corporation requests that the Hearings Examiner adopt the recommendation of the Executive Director and certify Bastrop West Water System for those areas described by the Executive Director. Bastrop West

Phillips, Chief Clerk of the Texas Water Commission, do hereby certify that the following is a true and correct copy of Minutes of the Texas Water Commission of the meeting conducted on August 25, 1987, at 2:00 p.m. concerning the Examiner's Proposal for Decision on an Application by Eastrop West Water Systems.

"The Texas Water Commission convened at 2:00 p.m., Tuesday, August 25, 1987, for consideration of the Agenda. Chairman Hopkins, Commissioner Roming and certain Commission personnel and other persons as listed below were in attendance. By operation of law, the Executive Director and the Public Interest Advocate of the Texas Water Commission were made parties to all proceedings. Commissioner Houchins was absent and excused.

"Considered was Examiner's Proposal for Decision on an Application by Bastrop West Water Systems for a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity to provide water utility service in Bastrop County (Docket No. 7047-C).

\*This matter was first heard before a Commission hearings examiner at an adjudicative public hearing in Austin, Texas on November 25, 1986; February 18 and April 20, 21, and 22, 1987. The following were designated as parties to the proceeding: Bastrop West Water Systems, represented by John D. Stover, Attorney; Aqua Water Supply Corporation, represented by Robert H. Lloyd, Attorney; the Executive Director of the Commission, represented by Christopher Gee, Staff Attorney; and the Commission's Public Interest Advocate, Jack Cox, Attorney.

"Appearing on behalf of Bastrop West Water Systems were: John D. Stover, lawyer, Austin, Texas; and Clyde E. Clardy, Bastrop, Texas.

"Appearing on behalf of Aqua Water Supply were: Robin Lloyd, attorney, Austin, Texas; and John Burke, enginee. Austin, Texas.

"Marcella Sellers, Commission hearings examiner, briefed the Commission on this matter. She reported that the contested area during the public hearing was the area of Bastrop County West Subdivision. She further discussed the issues of the hearing regarding this CCN. It was recommended that the Commission issue the CCN to Mr. Clardy for the present 14 connections in Bastrop County West plus the uncontested areas. She also recommended that all exceptions be overruled.

"John Stover discussed the contested area, Rastrop County West Subdividion using a map of the area. He gave some background information on Aqua Water Supply and Bastrop West. He urged the Commission to grant his motion to re-open the evidence in order to include the information on the number of connections approved by the Department of Health.

"Robin Lloyd, attorney, representing Aqua Water Supply, noted that they were willing to support the recommendations of the examiner.

He also noted that there was no objection for Mr. Clardy to continue to serve the 14 customers he was already serving. Mr. Lloyd also discussed the improvements and capacity of the Aqua Water Supply facility. It was noted that Aqua Water Supply would be applying to amend their CCN so there would not be dual certification.

"Christopher Gee, staff attorney, noted agreement with examiner's proposal and requested adoption as proposed. Mr. Gee noted, however, concerns of well capacity if more than 14 connections were approved in the Bastrop West Subdivision.

"Mr. Gee responded to questions by Mr. Roming and noted that he believed that dual certification would not be appropriate in this proceeding.

"Mr. Stover discussed the matter regarding limitations of the 14 connections. He requested that the Commission allow future connections as approved by the Department of Health.

"After further discussion, Commissioner Roming moved that the Examiner's Proposal for Decision be adopted as recommended and all exceptions overruled. The motion was seconded by Chairman Hopkins and carried with two "ayes" and no "noes." A formal order was adopted to become effective when signed and is on file in the office of the Commission.

AN ORDER issuing Certificate of Convenience and Necessity No. 12050 to Eastrop West Water Systems

On August 25, 1987, the Texas Water Commission (Commission) considered the application of Bastrop West Water Systems for Certificate of Convenience and Necessity No. 12050 under TEX. WATER CODE ANN. \$13.241 et seq. (Vernon Supp. 1987), and the Rules of the Texas Water Commission. The application was presented to the Commission with a Proposal for Decision by Marcella Sellers, Attorney, a Commission Hearings Examiner, who conducted an adjudicative public hearing concerning the application on November 25, 1986; February 18, 1987; and on April 20, 21, and 22, 1987.

The Hearings Examiner designated the following as parties to the proceeding: the applicant, Bastrop West Water Systems; the Execu ive Director and the Public Interest Advocate of the Commission; and Aqua Water Supply Corporation.

After considering the Hearings Examiner's Proposal for Decision, exceptions thereto, and the evidence and arguments presented, the Commission makes the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law:

### FINDINGS OF FACT

 Bastrop West Water Systems has applied to the Commission for Certificate of Convenience and Necessity No. 12050 to

1. Lat & A to

authorize the provision of water utility service to Bastrop County West Subdivision, an adjacent 40-acre tract, Bastrop County West Oaks Subdivision and an adjacent tract bordering Edmonson Lane in Bastrop County, Texas.

- Proper notice of the application and the public hearing was given pursuant to <u>Texas Water Code</u> \$13.246 and 31 TAC \$291.109.
  - September 22 and 29, 1986 in the Bastrop Advertiser, a newspaper generally circulated in Bastrop County, Texas, which is the location in which the certification is sought.
  - b. Notice of the public hearing was mailed on October 14, 1986 by the Chief Clerk of the Commission to all parties and to any person requesting a hearing.
  - c. Notice of the application was mailed to Aqua Water Supply Corporation, a neighboring utility, according to 31 TAC \$291.109(b).
  - A public hearing on the application for Certificate of Convenience and Necessity No. 12050 was held on November 25, 1986; February 18, 1987; and on April 20, 21, and 22, 1987 in Austin, Texas.

- Bastrop West Water Systems presently provides water utility service to 14 customers in Bastrop County West Subdivision.
- 5. No other water utility provides service to Bastrop County West Oaks Subdivision, the 40-acre tract adjacent to Bastrop County West Subdivision, or the tract adjacent to Bastrop County West Oaks Subdivision bordering Edmonson Lane.
- 6. Bastrop West Water Systems serves approximately four customers in the Edmonson Lane area.
- 7. The service provided by Bastrop West Water Systems to customers in Bastrop County West Subdivision has been adequate.
- B. The service provided by Aqua Water Supply Corporation to customers in Bastrop County West Subdivision has been inadequate.
  - a. Homeowners living in Bastrop County West Subdivision have experienced low water pressure or no water pressure during the summers of the 1980s.
  - b. Customers have not received prompt responses to complaints made to Aqua Water Supply Corporation.
  - c. Customers have had problems with mineral salts in the water provided by Aqua Water Supply Corporation.
  - d. Customers experienced problems using appliances with water supplied by Aqua Water Supply Corporation.

- e. Homeowners in Bastrop County West Subdivision could not obtain connections to Acua Water Supply Corporation in 1985 due to a moratorium on connections by the Texas Department of Health.
- 9. There is a need for additional water service to Bastrop County West Oaks, the 40-acre tract adjacent to Bastrop County West Subdivision, and the tract adjacent to Bastrop County West Oaks bordering Edmonson Lane.
  - a. There is no other utility certificated for water service in these areas.
  - b. Clyde Clardy is in the process of developing Bastrop
     West Oaks Subdivision.
  - c. Bastrop West Water Systems currently serves approximately four customers in the Edmonson Lane area.
  - d. Population projections reflect a need for additional service.
    - (1) The areas named should have approximately the following populations by the years listed: 1987-10; 1990-125; 1995-245; 2000-315.
    - (2) The population figures in Subfinding 9d.(1) support the following numbers of connections: 1987-2.8; 1990-35.7; 1995-70; 2000-90.
    - (3) All areas requested for certification should have the following populations by the years

listed: 1987-115; 1990-335; 1995-245; 2000-315.

- (4) The population figures in subfinding 9d.(3) support the following number of connections: 1987-33: 1990-96; 1995-146; and 2000-165.
- 10. There is a need for continued service by Bastrop West Water Systems for customers in Bastrop County West Subdivision currently connected to the system for the reasons listed in Findings of Fact Nos. 8.a.-8.e.
- 11. Granting the certificate to Bastrop West Water Systems will have a positive effect on Bastrop West Water Systems.
  - a. Granting the certificate will enable the Company to continue to provide service to its customers in Bastrop County West Subdivision and in the Edmonson Lane area.
  - b. Granting the certificate for the areas included in the attached certificate will give the Company more time to develop another water source.
    - (1) Groundwater resources are scarce in Bastrop County.
    - (2) The Company's investigation of new water sources has not gone beyond preliminary contacts.

- c. Granting the certificate in the form attached will avoid a duplication of services as Aqua Water System Corporation is lawfully extended into Bastrop County West Subdivision.
- d. Considering the population and connection figures in Subfindings 9d.(1) and 9d.(2) plus the 14 connections currently served by the Company in Bastrop County West Subdivision, the Company would serve 104 connections by the year 2000.
- 12. The Company's current well capacity will not allow the Company to serve all the areas requested considering the year and connection figures in Subfinding 9d.(4).
- Granting the certificate will have no adverse effect on Aqua Water Supply Corporation.
  - a. Granting the certificate will not cause a need for disconnection from Aqua Water Supply Corporation by any customer.
  - b. The loss of 14 connections in Bastrop County West Subdivision will not have a significant effect on Aqua Water Supply Corporation, which serves almost all of Bastrop County and also serves customers in Lee, Travis, Williamson, Caldwell, and Fayette Counties.
  - c. Aqua Water Supply Corporation will be able to serve future customers in Bastrop County West Subdivision;

Aqua Water Supply Corporation's distribution lines already run down all the streets in Bastrop County West Subdivision.

- d. The granting of the certificate will not require Bastrop West Water Systems to place any significant extension lines in Bastrop County West Subdivision.
- e. Customers in Bastrop County West Subdivision currently served by Bastrop West Water Systems prefer the service provided by Bastrop West Water Systems.
- 14. Granting the certificate to the Company will result in a lowering of costs to the consumer.
  - a. Bastrop West Water Systems charges approximately \$15.00 for the first 3000 callons and \$1.40 per thousand gallons thereafter.
  - b. Aqua Water Supply Corporation charges \$15.00 per month for the first 3000 gallons and \$1.40 per thousand gallons for the next 3000 gallons; it charges \$1.10 per thousand gallons for the next 4000 gallons, \$1.00 per thousand gallons for the next 4000 gallons and \$0.90 per thousand gallons in excess of 14,000 gallons.
  - c. The tap fee charged by Bastrop West Water Systems, \$400, is less than the tap fce charged by Aqua Water. Supply Corporation, \$600.

- 15. Granting the certificate will result in a slight improvement of service.
  - a. Customers who have been provided service by both companies prefer the service provided by Bastrop West Water Systems.
  - b. Bastrop West Water Systems has fewer miles of lines 'o service.
  - c. Customers in Bastrop County West Subdivision were unable to obtain water service from Aqua Water Supply Corporation; Bastrop West Water Systems provided needed water corvice.
  - 16. There will be no adverse impact on community values, recreational and park areas, historical and aesthetic values, or environmental integrity.

# CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- The public hearing regarding this application was held under the authority of and in accordance with Chapter 13 of the <u>Texas Water Code</u> and 31 TAC Chapter 291.
- 2. The rexas Water Commission has jurisdiction to consider the application and is authorized to issue a certificate of convenience and necessity for the provision of water utility service.
- Bastrop West Water Systems is a public utility as defined by <u>Texas Water Code</u> \$13.002(3).

- 4. Certification of Bastrop West Water Systems is necessary for the service, accommodation, convenience, or safety of the public; therefore, issuance of the certificate is appropriate under <u>Texas Water Code</u> 513.246(b).
- 5. The Commission has considered the factors set forth in Texas Water Code \$13.246(c), has made Findings of Fact thereon, and concludes that the application should be granted and the certificate should be issued in order to implement the policies of this State as set forth in Chapter 13 of the Texas Water Code and to administer all powers therein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE TEXAS WATER COMMISSION THAT:

- The application of Bastrop West Water Systems for Certificate of Convenience and Necessity No. 12056 be approved as herein provided.
- 2. All exceptions submitted are hereby overruled.
- 3. The chief Clerk of the Texas Water Commission forward a certified copy of this Order to all parties and, subject to the filing of motions for rehearing, issue the certificate.
- 4. If any provision, sentence, clause or phrase of this Order is for any reason held to be invalid, the invalidity of any portion shall not effect the validity of the remaining portions of the Order.

After reviewing the certificate and CCN maps further, I determined BWWS (CCN 12050) only has dual certification with Aqua WSC's (CCN No. 10294) for some portions of CCN No. 12050. Please see the attached CCN map showing those portions of BWWS's water CCN, which are dually certified with Aqua WSC and those BWWS's CCN service areas with single certification. Please note the dually certificated CCN service areas between 12050 and 10294 are not close to the location of 168 Edmonson Lane address/property.

Unfortunately, the viewer does not show areas of dual certification clearly. Therefore, I obtained this information using our GIS and reviewing the WRS-11 map referenced in the certificate. I can see how using the viewer, it looks like all of BWWS is dually certified with Aqua WSC. However, this is not the case.

Regarding the documents you provided, please let me know what lot number or lot numbers are associated with the J. Hinkle's property. Also, confirm whether or not Exhibit B and C of the metes and bounds are both part of the J. Hickle property.

Tomorrow I will be able to finish review the official CCN file, which should include the CCN maps [7047(A), 7047(B), and 7047 (C)] referenced in the certificate and issued to BWWS with Application No. 7047 C. Since this matter involves a property to be sold and Ms. Hinkle needs TCEQ's validation of the authorized water CCN service provider to the property, I must finish my research of the official CCN file to make my final determination.
