

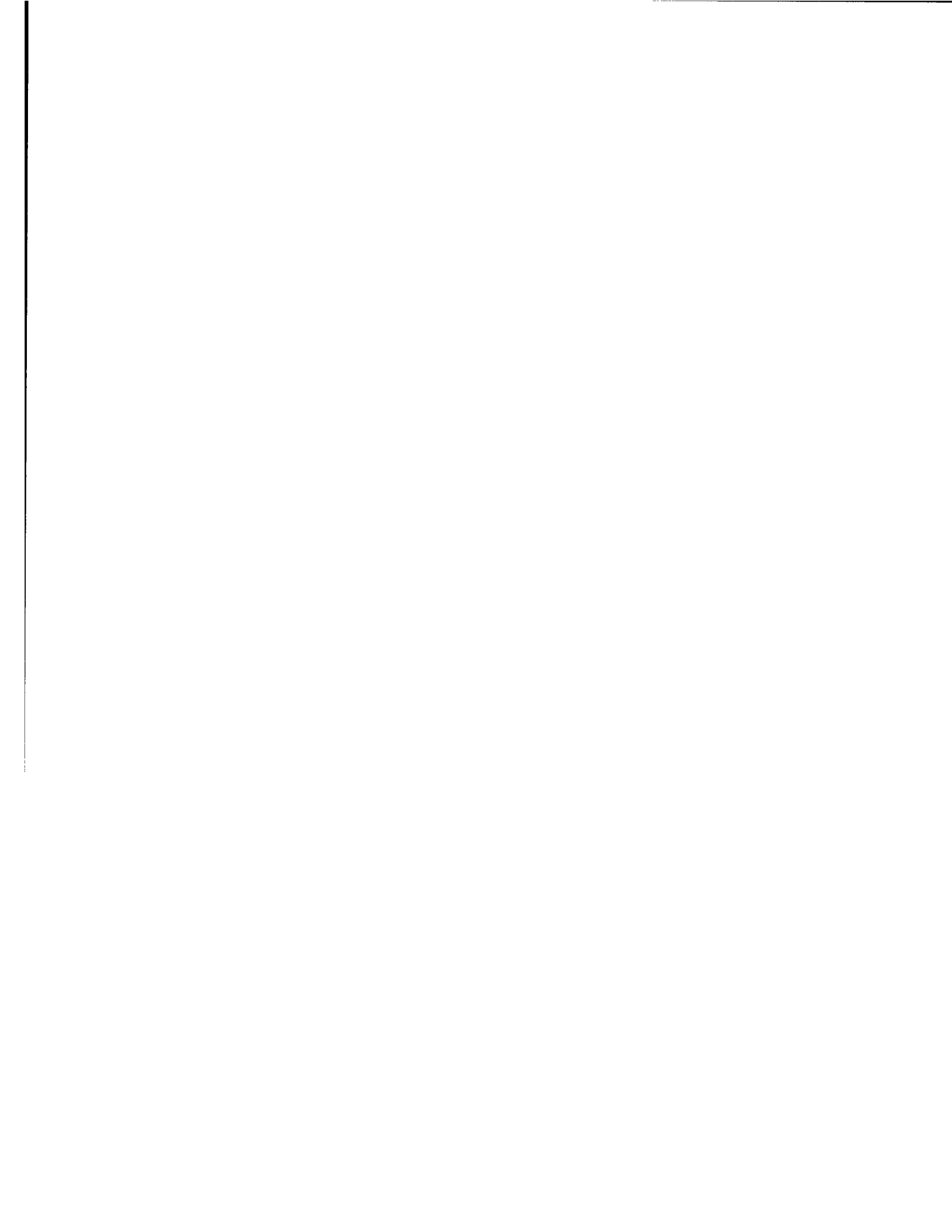

**ORDER NO. 5
FINDING APPLICATION CONTINUES TO BE INCOMPLETE AND
DEFICIENT; ESTABLISHING DEADLINES AND OPPORTUNITY TO CURE**

I. Application

On September 30, 2015, the City of Edinburg (Edinburg) and North Alamo Water Supply Corporation (North Alamo WSC) (collectively, Applicants) filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) a joint application to amend Edinburg's water certificate of convenience (CCN) No. 12106 and to decertify a portion of North Alamo WSC's water CCN No. 10553 in Hidalgo County. On November 9, 2015, the application was found to be administratively incomplete.

**II. Staff Supplemental Recommendation on
Administrative Completeness of the Application**

On February 10, 2016, Commission Staff filed a supplemental recommendation on the application. Commission Staff determined that the application remains administratively incomplete because it contains additional material deficiencies, as specifically described in Commission Staff's February 10, 2016 filing and the attached memorandum of Sean Scaff and Kristy Nguyen of the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division. Pursuant to 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 24.8(a), applications are not considered filed until a determination of administrative completeness is made; thus, at this time the application is not considered filed with the Commission.

III. Proposed Procedural Schedule

Commission Staff proposes that Applicant be given until March 10, 2016, to address the additional deficiencies identified by Commission Staff. Commission Staff proposes to file a

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supplemental recommendation regarding completeness of the amended application on April 12, 2016.

IV. Finding Application Incomplete and Deficient, Providing Opportunity to Cure

Consistent with Commission Staff's supplemental recommendation, Applicants' amended application remains administratively incomplete and deficient. On or before **March 10, 2016**, Applicants shall amend the application to cure the additional deficiencies identified by Commission Staff. Processing of the application cannot proceed until the requested items are received and reviewed.

On or before **April 12, 2016**, Commission Staff shall file a supplemental recommendation regarding administrative completeness, along with a proposed procedural schedule if deemed administratively complete.
