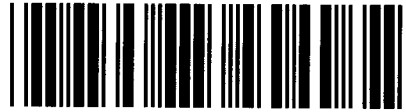

**ORDER NO. 2
REGARDING PROCESSING, SUFFICIENCY OF APPLICATION,
ESTABLISHING DEADLINES, AND OPPORTUNITY TO CURE**

I. Application

On September 30, 2015, the City of Edinburg (Edinburg) and North Alamo Water Supply Corporation (North Alamo WSC) (collectively, Applicants) filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) a joint application to amend Edinburg's water certificate of convenience (CCN) No. 12106 and to decertify a portion of North Alamo WSC's water CCN No. 10553 in Hidalgo County.

II. Staff Recommendation Regarding Application Processing and Sufficiency

On November 5, 2015, Commission Staff recommended that this application be processed pursuant to Tex. Water Code §§ 13.241-.250, regarding the certificate of convenience and necessity amendment portion of the application and processed pursuant to TWC § 13.255 regarding the decertification portion of the application. Consistent with Commission Staff's recommendation, this application will be processed under TWC §§ 13.241-.250 and 13.255.

Commission Staff recommended that the application be found insufficient for filing because it contains material deficiencies, as specifically described in Commission Staff's filing and the attached memorandum of Sean Scaff and Kristy Nguyen of the Commission's Water Utility Regulation Division. Pursuant to 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 24.8(a), applications are not considered filed until a determination of administrative completeness is made; thus, at this time the application is not considered filed with the Commission.

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III. Proposed Procedural Schedule

Commission Staff proposed that Applicants be given until December 8, 2015, to address the deficiencies identified by Commission Staff. Commission Staff proposes to file a supplemental recommendation, along with a proposed procedural schedule, if appropriate.


IV. Finding Application Insufficient for Filing, Providing Opportunity to Cure

Consistent with Commission Staff's recommendation, the application is found insufficient for filing. On or before **December 8, 2015**, Applicants shall amend the application to cure the deficiencies described by Commission Staff. Processing of the application cannot proceed until the requested items are received and reviewed.

On or before **January 8, 2016**, Commission Staff shall file a supplemental recommendation, along with a proposed procedural schedule for continued processing, if appropriate.
