APPLICATION OF MONARCH UTILITIES I, L.P. AND ROMARK UTILITY COMPANY FOR SALE, TRANSFER, OR MERGER OF FACILITIES AND CERTIFICATE RIGHTS IN POLK COUNTY

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COMMISSION STAFF'S RESPONSE TO ORDER NO. 2 & RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

COMES NOW the Staff (Staff) of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission), representing the public interest and files this Response to Order No. 2 & Recommendation on Administrative Completeness.

I. BACKGROUND

On November 4, 2015, Monarch Utilities I, L.P. (Monarch) and Romark Utility Company (Romark) (jointly Applicants) filed an application for approval of a sale, transfer, or merger (STM) of facilities and certificate rights in Polk County. Applicants seek approval to transfer, but also request amendment of uncertificated area and decertification of portions of the service area to be transferred. The application requests cancellation of Romark's water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) No. 10116 and amendment of Monarch's CCN No. 12983. This application affects approximately 387 acres and 125 current customers in the Oak Terrace Estates Subdivision.

On December 9, 2015, Order No. 2 was issued, requiring Staff to file a recommendation on administrative completeness of the application and notice along with a proposed procedural schedule by February 9, 2016. Therefore, this Response is timely filed.

II. COMMENTS ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS AND NOTICE

As detailed in the attached memorandum of Mary Lupo and Kristy Nguyen, in the Commission's Water Utilities Division, Staff finds the Applicants have cured all application and notice deficiencies. Therefore, Staff recommends the application be deemed administratively complete pursuant to 16 Tex. Admin. Code §§ 24.109 and 24.112 (TAC).

The Commission's notice requirements for STM applications are provided by 16 TAC § 24.112. Specifically, Staff recommends the Applicants be directed to provide the attached notice to the following:

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- a) any districts, groundwater conservation districts, counties, utilities, cities, cities with an extraterritorial jurisdiction within two miles of the proposed service area;
- b) any city with an extraterritorial jurisdiction which overlaps the proposed service area;
- c) any customers transferred, or other affected parties in the requested area;
- d) notice to the public which must be published once each week for two (2) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Polk County; and
- e) notice to the county judge of each county and to each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partly included in the area proposed to be certified.

Applicants should notify the following entities in addition to the neighboring entities listed in its application: David Lee Sheffield, Temple WSC.

Additionally, Staff recommends Applicants be ordered to include a copy of a map showing the proposed service area with the individual notices to neighboring utilities and other affected parties. Information related to districts including addresses can be obtained from the TCEQ web site located at <u>http://www.14.tceg.texas.gov/iwud/</u>.

III. PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Staff recommends the following procedural schedule:

Deadline for Applicants to file with the Commission a copy of the actual notice issued, the map issued with the individual mailed notice, tear sheets of the newspaper notice, and the signed affidavits (copies attached) indicating that notice was given.

On November 5, 2015, Monarch Utilities I, L.P. (Monarch) and Romark Utility Company (Romark) (collectively, Applicants) filed an application for approval of a sale, transfer, or merger (STM) of facilities and certificate rights in Polk County, Texas. As a result of the proposed transaction, Romark's water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) No. 10116 will be cancelled and Monarch's water CCN No. 12983 will be expanded to include the proposed area. In addition to the sale, transfer or merger, Monarch is requesting to decertify, approximately 36 acres of Romark's existing water CCN No. 10116 and to add adjoining uncertified area of approximately 169 acres to its existing water CCN No. 12983. This application is being reviewed pursuant to the criteria in Tex. Water Code §§ 13.241, 13.246, and 13.301 (TWC) and 16 Tex. Admin. Code §§ 24.102, 24.109, and 24.112 (TAC).

I have reviewed the application and recommend that it be deemed administratively complete and sufficient for filing. I further recommend that the Applicants be ordered to do the following:

- 1) In addition to those entities listed in the application, provide notice the following entities located within a 2-mile buffer of the proposed water service areas requested with this
 - a) David Lee Sheffield
 - b) Temple WSC
- 2) Provide the correct notice of the application to the following:
 - a) any districts, groundwater conservation districts, counties, utilities, cities, cities with an extraterritorial jurisdiction within two (2) miles of the proposed service areas;

 - b) any city with an extraterritorial jurisdiction which overlaps the proposed service areas; and c) any customers transferred, or other affected parties in the requested area;

- d) notice to the public which must be published once each week for two (2) consecutive weeks
 in a newspaper of general circulation in Polk County; and
- e) Notice to the county judge of each county and to each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partly included in the area proposed to be certified.
- 3) Include a copy of a map showing the proposed service areas with the individual notices to neighboring utilities, customers and other affected parties. It is the Applicant's burden to provide an accurate map delineating the proposed service areas with each individual notice. Information related to districts including addresses can be obtained by the Applicant from the TCEQ web site located at <u>http://www14.tceq.texas.gov/iwud/</u>.

For the proposed area that is currently uncertified only:

- 1) The applicant shall mail notice to each owner of a tract of land that is at least 25 acres and is wholly or partially included in the area proposed to be certified.
- 2) File copies of the actual notices sent and signed affidavit (blank forms attached).

Monarch Utilities I, L.P., 12535 Reed Road, Sugar Land, TX 77478, has submitted an application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas to transfer and cancel CCN No. 10116 of <u>Romark Utility Company</u>, 108 S. Washington, Livingston, TX 77351, in Polk County.

The sale is scheduled to take place as approved by the Commission (V.T.C.A., Water Code \$13.301). The transaction and the transfer of a portion CCN No. 10116 includes the following subdivision:

Oak Terrace Estates

In addition to the transfer, <u>Monarch Utilities I, L.P.</u> is requesting to amend its <u>CCN No. 12983</u> by adding adjoining uncertified area of approximately <u>169 acres</u> and decertifying approximately <u>36</u> acres.

Affected persons may file written protests and/or request a public hearing within 30 days of this notice.

A request for public hearing must be in writing to request a hearing, you must:

(1) your name, mailing address, and daytime telephone number;

(2) the applicant's name, application number or another recognizable reference to this application;

(3) the statement, "I/we request a public hearing";

(4) a brief description of how you or the persons you represent, would be adversely affected by the granting of the application for a CCN; and
(5) your proposed adjustment to the application or CCN which would satisfy your concerns and cause you to withdraw your request for a hearing.

Only those persons who submit a written request to be notified of a hearing will receive notice if a hearing is scheduled. The Commission will issue the CCN requested in the referenced application unless a hearing is scheduled to consider the transaction. If no protests or requests for hearing are filed during the comment period, the Commission may issue the CCN 30 days after publication of this notice.
